The Seattle City Council's Housing, Human Services, Health, and Culture Committee will hold a public hearing on [Resolution 31408](#).

Resolution 31408 makes findings regarding the need for a City intervention into the Seattle Indian Services Commission's affairs and following a public hearing authorizes the Mayor to undertake an intervention in order to correct the deficiencies identified in the 2010 Report of the State Auditor and to ensure that the Commission's on-going operations are consistent with all legal requirements.

The City Council's Housing, Human Services, Health, and Culture Committee will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, September 26, 2:00 p.m. Council Chambers, 2<sup>nd</sup> floor, Seattle City Hall, 600 Fourth Avenue), to take testimony on Resolution 31408. The entrances to City Hall are located on Fourth and Fifth Avenues between James and Cherry Streets. For those who wish to testify, a sign-up sheet will be available inside the Council Chamber one-quarter hour before the public hearing. ## **Directions**

City Hall is located at 600 Fourth Avenue. Council Chambers is on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor of City Hall.

**Southbound on I-5:** Take the James Street exit #165A and turn right on Columbia or James Streets.

**Northbound on I-5:** Take the James Street exit #164A and turn left on James Street.

## **After Hours Access:**

City Hall is locked after 6:00 pm Mondays – Fridays. For access to an evening meeting after that time, go to southernmost door on the 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue entrance. Directly to the left (south) of the southernmost door, there is an intercom which is manned 24/7. Press the button and when the guard responds, tell him that you're attending the meeting in chambers. They will electronically open the door nearest you.

## **City Hall Parking**

There is no public event parking at City Hall other than a limited number of spaces that can be used for short-term needs. Nearby parking can be found in the SeaPark garage on Sixth and Cherry. City Hall is located one block due west of the garage. The vehicle entrances to the garage are on: 1) Cherry, mid-block between Fifth and Sixth Avenues; or 2) Sixth Avenue at James Street; or 3) James, mid-block between Fifth and Sixth Avenues. Remember to take the meeting agenda to the attendant at SeaPark to qualify for the special rate of \$3.
