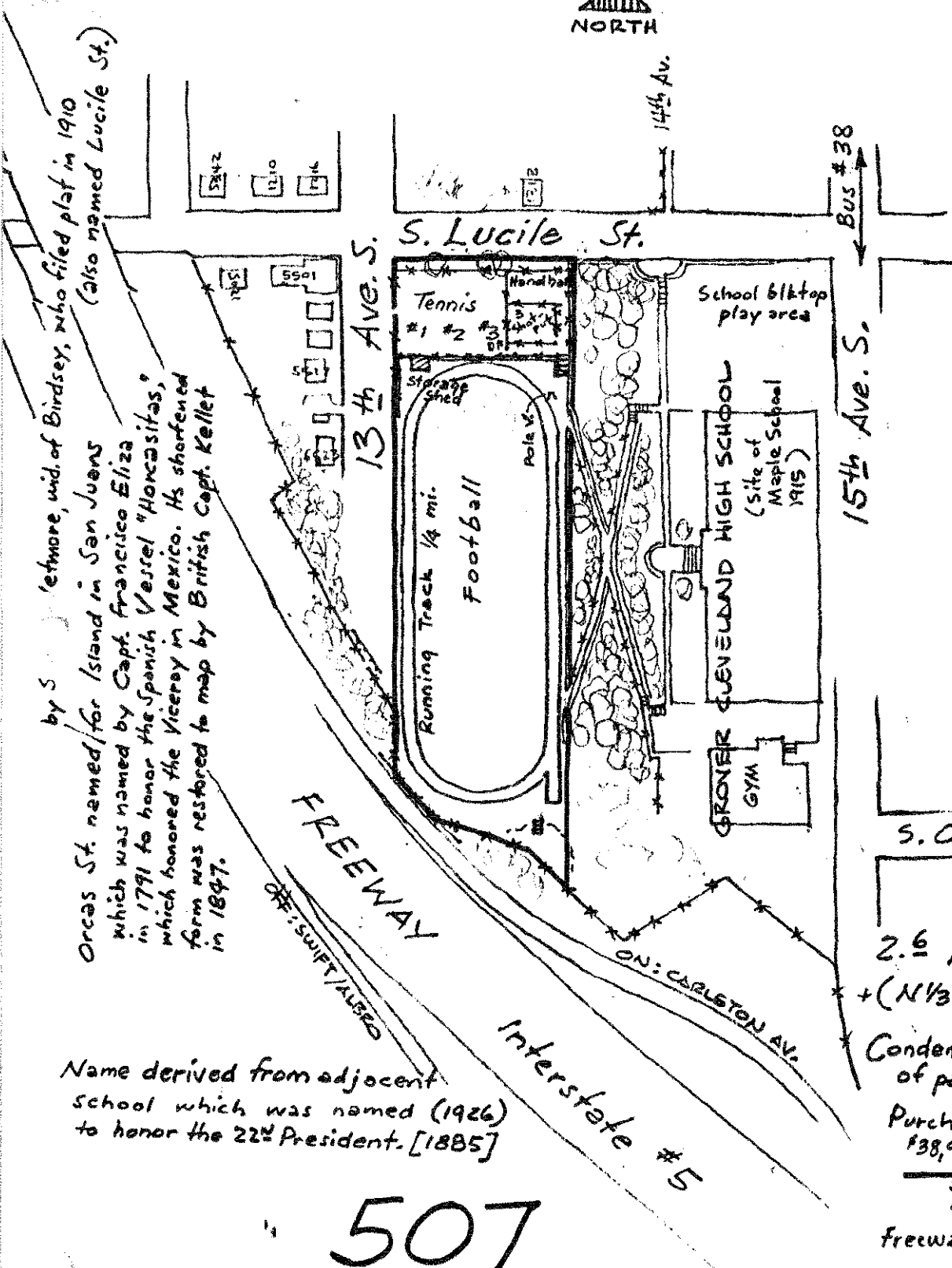


(Upon removal of homes + bldgs. on the site in 1931, the basements "may be left intact.")

 Orcas St. named for Island in San Juans which was named by Capt. Francisco Eliza in 1791 to honor the Spanish Vessel "Hercules", which honored the Viceroy in Mexico. Its shortened form was restored to map by British Capt. Kellet in 1847.

Name derived from adjacent school which was named (1926) to honor the 22<sup>nd</sup> President. [1885]
