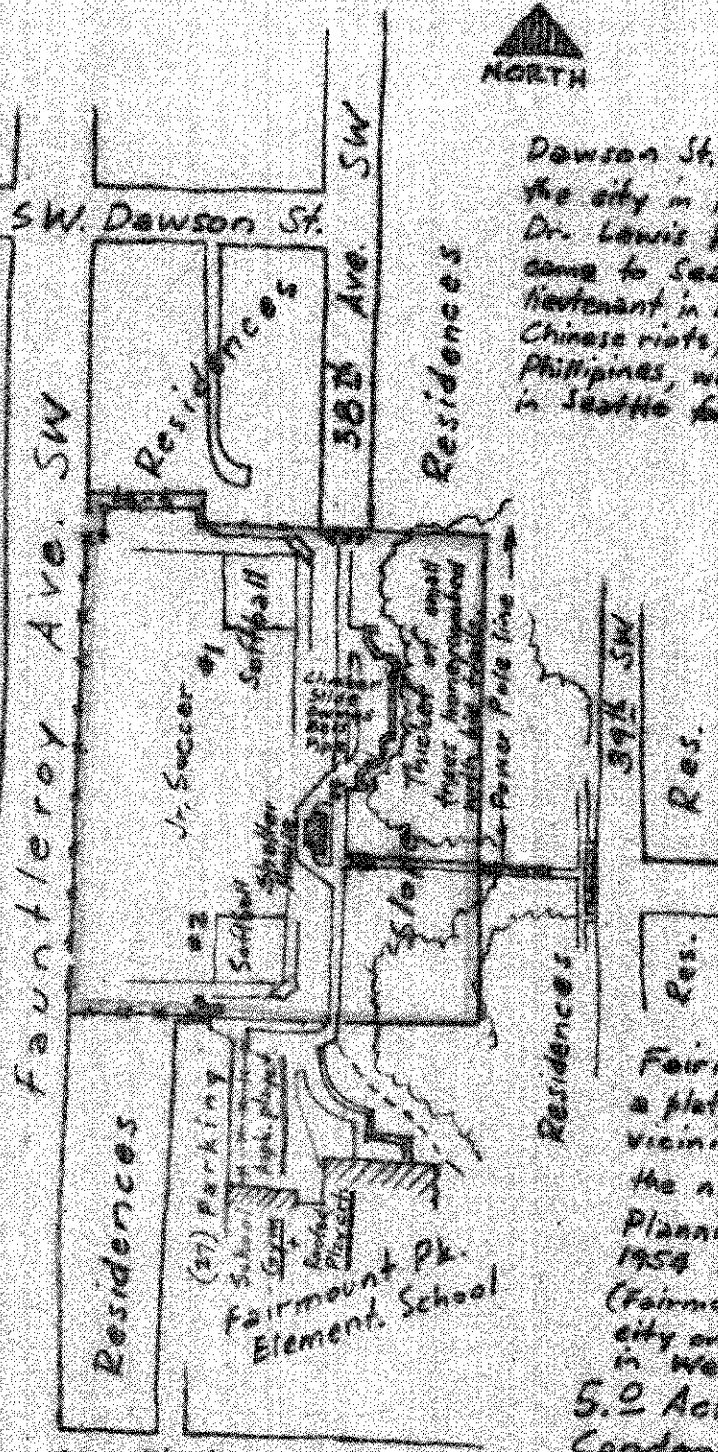


Fauntleroy Ave. follows the route of the early day traction line from Seattle to the Fauntleroy District, which was named given to Cave on Puget Sound by Lt. George Davidson to honor the family name of his bride-to-be, Elliner Fauntleroy.



Dawson St. named either for the city in Alaska or for Dr. Lewis R. Dawson who came to Seattle in 1880's: lieutenant in Navy Guard during Chinese riots, army surgeon in Philippines, well known pediatrician in Seattle for two generations.

SW. Brandon St.



Fairmount is the name of a plat filed 1907 (S.P. 1000) in the vicinity; a name applied to the neighborhood by the Planning Commission in the 1954 Recreation Report. (Fairmount is the name of a city on the Monongahela River in West Virginia; also a 'model' park in Philadelphia 1800s)
