



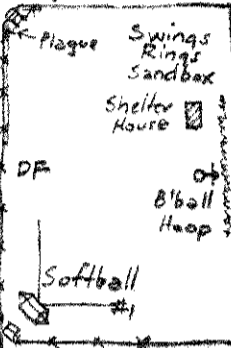
Residences

S. Angeline St.

Angeline St. named for the princess, daughter of Chief Sealth. It is said she was born near Atlantic City Park. At her request, she was buried in a canoe-shaped casket (Indian fashion) beside the pioneers at Lakeview Cem. She was named by Doc. Maynard's wife.

Plaque @ steps: In memory of Mrs. Johanna Almquist, Lakewood Pioneer, 1882-1928 (Placed 1930) (Had owned a major portion of property + donated \$50 = for a fountain; plaque was for fountain.) Lakewood is name of district, referring to Lake (Washington) to the east and the woods existing in the area at the time. First use of name on plat filed 1902 by J.S. Elliott, C.B. Dodge (Home Land Co.)

District included in original land grant to Chas. Waters, 1872, of Somerville, Mass., for 350 ac. which he named "Somerville".
