


Community name of 'Laurelhurst' and the name of 'Laurel Shade' which Judge Mc Gilver gave to his homestead just across the bay (now Madison Park) would indicate a notable presence of Laurel in the area at the time of early settlement. "Hurst" is defined as "a wood, grove, wooded hill or hillock".

First use of "Laurelhurst" - plot filed 1906 by J.R. McLaughlin + R.F. Booth (McLaughlin Realty Co.), F.F. Mead + P.C. Murphy (Seaboard Security Co.), E.L. Price + W.A. Surber, (Mortgages)

- 1929 Improv. begun
- 1934 Center built, CWA
- 1940 Community don. \$750 T.C. + fence
- 1944 Comm. Ch. \$14,000 32 BF + WERA/CWA
- 1950 Gym - \$79,261 48 BF + St. Grant
- Proposed L.I.D. for field redevelopment, rejected 1962

GYM: 60' x 100' = 857 persons w/ lockers + showers, kitchenette
 Gymnasium at school was first of joint planning + financing of Gymnasium by Park + School - 1950 (\$79,261 = 48 BF + St. Grant) (Prior to this the U.W. Pavilion had been used.)

P.F. used as barracks and gun site 1944-45; barracks kept as part payment for Army use - purchased by Laurelhurst Co-op Playgroup. (\$77k) 1945
 P.G. bought the trailer for storage purposes, replaced 1957.
