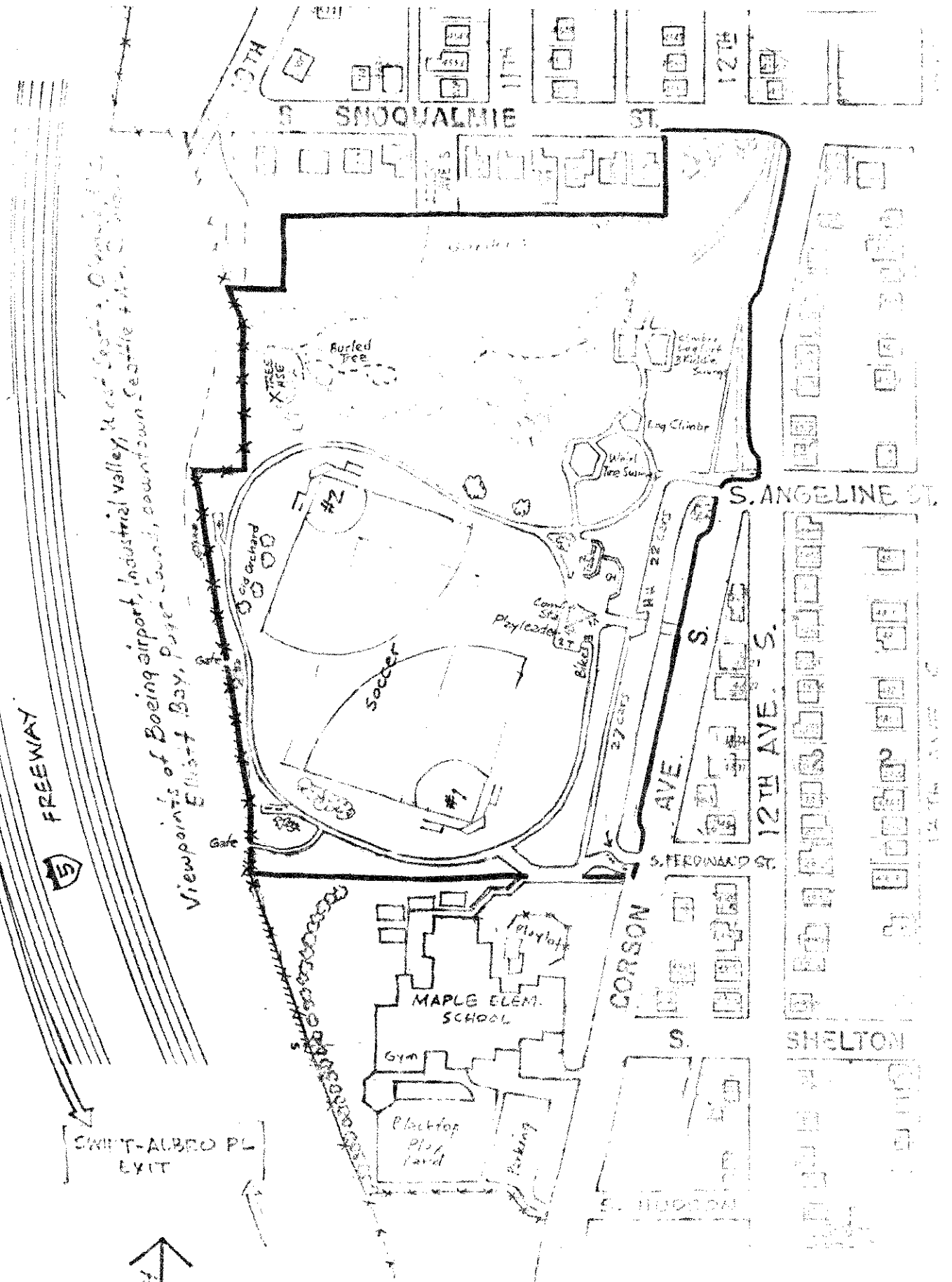


Snogualmie St. is from the Indian word for "moon" - Snogualmi - from whence came the legendary ancestors of the tribe (legend of "The Changer"). The ancestral village was on the banks of the Snogualmi Mt. River. Patkanim was Chief during Pioneer Days and is patron chief of Everett. The Indian trail thru Snogualmie Pass was used by Hudson Bay Co. trappers and in 1854 Lt. Abiel Tinkham, accompanied by an Indian guide, established the feasibility of a wagon road: a portion of which is identified near the Denny Creek Camp @ Snogualmie Pass.

landed - Pioneer for Snogualmie  
 name honors the pioneer family of Loco (the one who staked a Donation Claim in 1851 in the Snohomish valley (now Boeing Airport), Samuel Maple done and for a school in 1865 on the side of the slipper (now 12th St). The site was "moved" in 1900, again in 1926 and then to this location in 1971. First teacher was Sam W. Johnson. The D.L. WOOD name was chosen from community suggestions.
