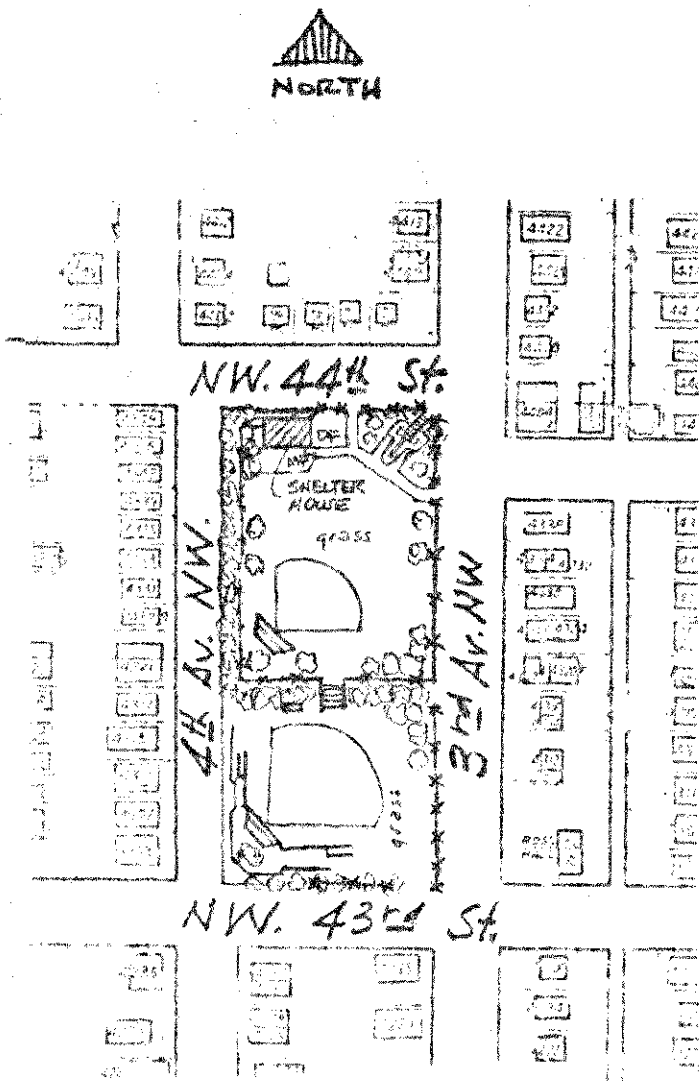

Name taken from school formerly on south half of playground. School had been named to honor John<sup>R</sup> Ross pioneer family who homesteaded in 1853. Early settlement called Ross, had school district and seminary in 1900. First school in settlement was in Ross home in 1873.

(James D. Ross, the first supt. + "Father of Seattle City Life" was born in Canada and came to Seattle about 1906. Died 1940: Ross Dam on Skagit River, completed in 1949, was named for him.) [Ross Island honor surgeon Wm. Ross, MD, Insp. Genl, Hospitals + Fleets, HMS.] 1853
