ORDINANCE NO. 1.

FOR THE PREVENTION OF DRUNKENNESS, INDECENT OR DISORDERLY CONDUCT IN THE CITY OF SEATTLE.

Approved Dec. 22, 1889.

The City of Seattle ordains as follows :

THAT any person who may hereafter be guilty of drunkenness, indecent or disorderly conduct in any street, road, lane, alley or any public place within the limits of the City of Seattle, shall be arrested by the City Marshal, or upon the complaint of any citizen, and taken before the City Recorder of the said City of Seattle for examination, and if deemed guilty of violating this Ordinance, said City Recorder may fine the person so arrested in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars and costs, and in default of payment of said fine, the person so offending shall be committed to the custody of the said City Marshal under whose supervision he may be put at work on any road

SEC. 2.—That if any person shall intentionally and unlawfully ride, drive or leave a vehicle upon a sidewalk within the said City of Chicago, he shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined a sum of money not exceeding twenty-five dollars.

SEC. 3.—Persons violating
may be apprehended by the
act; or arrested upon a warrant
