ORDINANCE NO. 100337

AN ORDINANCE providing for the laying off, opening, widening, and establishing of 5th AVENUE NORTH between Valley Street and Republican Street at the existing center line grade; providing for the condemnation, appropriation, taking and damaging of land and other property necessary therefor; providing for the condemnation of property or property rights necessary for cut and fill slopes; and iding for payment therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That public necessity and convenience demand that 5th AVENUE NORTH be and the same is hereby laid off, opened, widened and established over and across the following described property, in King County, Washington, to wit:

The west 14.0 feet of Lots 8 through 13 inclusive, Block 63, D. T. Denny's Home Addition to the City of Seattle, as recorded in Volume 3 of Plats, page 115, Records of King County, Washington; TOGETHER WITH the west 14.0 feet of Republican Street as vacated by Ordinance 90487, lying between Block 63 and Block 62 said addition; Also,

The west 21 feet of Lots 7 through 12 inclusive, Block 48, Replat of Blocks 44 through 53 inclusive, Mercer's Second Addition to North Seattle, as recorded in Volume 9 of Plats, page 54, Records of King County, Washington; Also,

The west 18.0 feet of Lots 7 through 12 inclusive, Block 47, Replat of Blocks 44 through 53 inclusive, Mercer's Second Addition to North Seattle, as recorded in Volume 9 of Plats, page 54, Records of King County, Washington.

Section 2. That in the grading of 5th AVENUE NORTH between Valley Street and Republican Street, in conformity with the existing center line grade, the City shall acquire the right in the case of a cut or fill to remove the lateral support of the property abutting upon 5th AVENUE NORTH and in every case the right to remove said lateral support shall include the right to carry the slopes back into and extending upon the abutting real property 2 feet horizontally for each foot of depth of cut or for each foot of elevation of fill for the purpose of providing lateral support for 5th AVENUE NORTH, reserving unto the abutting property owners, respectively, the right at any time to replace said cut slopes and to remove said fill slopes upon providing and maintaining other adequate lateral support.

Section 3. That all lands, rights, privileges and other property, lying within the limits of the lots and blocks described in Section 1 hereof, are hereby condemned, appropriated, taken and damaged for the purpose therein enumerated; and that all lands, rights, privileges and other property necessary to be taken,

used or damaged in the grading of 5th AVENUE NORTH in conformity with existing center line grade and in the construction of necessary slopes for cuts or fills upon the real property abutting 5th AVENUE NORTH as set forth in Section 2 hereof, are hereby condemned, appropriated, taken and damaged for the public use for such purposes, and all such lands, rights, privileges and other property are to be taken, damaged and appropriated only after just compensation has been made or paid into court for the owners thereof in the manner provided by law.

Section 4. That such acquisitions as are herein above described, are hereby declared to be an addition to the Urban Arterial System as accepted by the Urban Arterial Board and the cost of such acquisition shall be paid from the Arterial City Street Fund, or from such general funds of the City of Seattle as may be provided by law.

Section 5. That the Corporation Council is hereby authorized and directed to begin and prosecute the actions and proceedings in the manner provided by law to condemn, take, damage and appropriate the lands and other property necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 6. That in conducting such condemnation proceedings, the Corporation Council is hereby authorized to enter into stipulations for the purpose of minimizing damages.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
