BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the deed executed on January 11, 1971, by E. F. Pugsley and Amelia B. Pugsley, conveying to the City of Seattle the following described real estate situate in Seattle, King County, Washington, to-wit:

Lots 1, 2 and 3, Block 13, Lake View Addition to the City of Seattle, according to the plat recorded in Volume 5 of Plats, page 34, in King County, Washington; EXCEPT that portion thereof lying south of a line which is distant 100 feet north from and parallel with the north line of Block 24, Lake Union Shore Lands, heretofore condemned in King County Superior Court Cause No. 125369 for street purposes, as provided by Ordinance No. 37483 of the City of Seattle; ALSO EXCEPT any portion of said Lot 3 lying within Northlake Avenue

be and the same is hereby accepted for street purposes (Northeast Pacific Street Relocation).

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.




