ORDINANCE 103000

AN ORDINANCE transferring jurisdiction and control of the Auditorium Annex in Seattle Center from the Building Department to the Seattle Center Department; renaming said structure the "Seattle Center Veterans' Annex" and amending Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of Ordinance 57142, to provide for administration thereof by the Seattle Center Director.

WHEREAS, the Auditorium Annex located at Seattle Center was constructed (Ordinances 52296 and 58825) with funds raised by general obligation bond issue approved by the voters on March 8, 1927, for a civic center with appurtenances upon real property purchased by the City pursuant to Ordinance 48898 by appropriation from the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 57142, as amended, authorized the Superintendent of Buildings, at such times as said Auditorium Annex was not required for other public purposes, to permit the use and occupancy thereof by certain named veterans' organizations; and

WHEREAS, the grounds of the Seattle Center and certain structures thereon were placed under the jurisdiction and control of the Seattle Center Department pursuant to Ordinance 94446 and RCW 35.22.305; and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Buildings and the Seattle Center Director have determined (C.F. 277443) that it would be to the benefit of the City for said Auditorium Annex to be transferred to the jurisdiction of the Seattle Center Department and have so requested; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That as requested by the Superintendent of Buildings and the Seattle Center Director in C.F. 277443, jurisdiction over that certain building known as the "Auditorium Annex," which is hereby designated and shall be known henceforth as the "Seattle Center Veterans' Annex," located on the grounds of the Seattle Center upon the following described real property:

Lots 10 and 11, Block 44, D.T. Denny's Home Addition to Seattle, Volume 3 of Plats, page 115, Records of King County, Washington, and the north one-half (1/2) of vacated (Ordinance 53343) Republican Street abutting said Block,

constructed pursuant to Ordinances 52296 and 58825 on lands purchased pursuant to Ordinance 48898, is hereby transferred to the Seattle Center Department from the Building Department.

Section 2. That Section 1 of Ordinance 57142, as last amended by Ordinance 82498, is further amended to read as follows:

Section 1. That the Seattle Center Director is hereby authorized to permit under his supervision and control, at such times as the same is not required for other public purposes, the use and occupancy of the building adjacent to the Opera House, known as the Seattle Center Veterans' Annex, by posts of the Grand Army of the Republic, Camps of the United Spanish War Veterans, posts of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, posts of the American Legion, chapters of the Disabled American Veterans of the World War, the 91st Division Association A.E.F. of Washington, the Second Washington and 161st Infantry Association, the Seattle Branch No. 32, Canadian Legion, the Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic, the Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War, the Fleet Reserve Association, Branch Eighteen, Seattle Club No. 8, Navy Mothers Clubs of America, Seattle Detachment Marine Corps League, and all other veterans' organizations nationally chartered by the Congress of the United States and organizations auxiliary to the foregoing: Provided, however, that organizations of veterans shall be given preference in such use and occupancy over such auxiliary organizations; Provided, further, that such use and occupancy shall not extend to the ground floor of said building.

Section 3. That Section 2 of Ordinance 57142, is amended to read as follows:

Section 2. That the organizations using or occupying said Seattle Center Veterans' Annex, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 hereof, shall jointly furnish, at their own cost and expense, all such operating services (excluding steam heat, water and electric service, but including janitor, telephone, gas, watchman's or other similar service) as they may require, subject,

however, to the approval of the Seattle Center Director. Each such organization shall pay its proportionate share of the total of such cost and expense, said share to bear the same proportion of such total cost as the number of times said building is used per month by such organization bears to the total number of times per month said building is used; provided, however, that in the event that any organization requires any service not required by the other organizations, it shall furnish such service at its sole cost and expense. The actual amounts of such shares shall be fixed by the Seattle Center Director whose determination thereof shall be final.

Section 4. That Section 3 of Ordinance 57142, is amended to read as follows:

Section 3. That in the administration of said building, the Seattle Center Director is hereby authorized to make, adopt and enforce, all reasonable rules and regulations necessary for the proper and orderly use of said building by the organizations mentioned in Section 1, and in the event of the violation of any of such rules or regulations or of the failure to pay its proportionate share of the cost of the operating services referred to in Section 2 hereof by any of said organizations, said Director is hereby authorized to revoke its permit to use and occupy said building, and to expel such organization therefrom.

Section 5. That Section 4 of Ordinance 57142, as last amended by Ordinance 69829, is further amended to read as follows:


Section 4. That there is hereby created an advisory board to advise and assist the Seattle Center Director in the administration of the Seattle Center Veterans' Annex (except the ground floor thereof), said board to consist of five persons, each of whom shall be a member in good standing of one of the organizations or associations mentioned in Section 1 hereof,

not more than two of whom, however, shall be members of the same post, camp, chapter or unit. The members of said board shall be appointed as follows: One each by the Mayor, the Seattle Center Director and the City Council, and two by a majority of the commanders or heads of the organizations or associations mentioned in Section 1 hereof, in meeting assembled. Each member of said Board shall serve for a period of five (5) years, unless sooner removed, except that the five (5) members first appointed shall serve one, two, three, four and five years, respectively; the length of service of each of said members to be determined by lot at the first meeting of the Board. Each member of said Board may be removed at the pleasure of the authority appointing him. Upon a vacancy by death, resignation, disability or removal, or the expiration of the term of office of any member, his successor shall be appointed by the authority which appointed him; Provided, that the Board, by majority vote of its remaining members, may fill such vacancy by election of a temporary appointee, who shall serve until such vacancy be filled by regular appointment. The Board shall annually select a chairman and a secretary from its members.



The members of said board shall be appointed as follows: One each by the Mayor, the SEATTLE CENTER DIRECTOR and the City Council, and two by a majority of the commanders or heads of the organizations or associations mentioned in Section 1 hereof, in meeting assembled. Each member of said Board shall serve for a period of five (5) years, unless sooner removed, except that the five (5) members first appointed shall serve one, two, three, four and five years, respectively; the length of service of each of said members to be determined by lot at the first meeting of the Board. Each member of said Board may be removed at the pleasure of the authority appointing him. Upon a vacancy by death, resignation, disability or removal or the expiration of the term of office of any member, his successor shall be appointed by the authority which appointed him; Provided that the Board, by majority vote of its remaining members, may fill such vacancy by election of a temporary appointee, who shall serve until


