AN ORDINANCE amending Section 1 of Ordinance 104083 to provide for inclusion within the City's Unemployment Compensation Program of employees on leave of absence prior to layoff.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance 104083 is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. A program of unemployment compensation is hereby established for eligible employees of The City of Seattle, including all such eligible employees of the Seattle Public Library upon adoption by the Board of Trustees of the Seattle Public Library of a resolution providing therefor. Employees whose service and pay are interrupted by layoff for lack of work or funds after November 1, 1974, including temporary employees, and who were employed full time by the City continuously for a period of one year immediately preceding such layoff, and who are not excluded by Section 3 of this ordinance, and who provide evidence that they are available for and are actively seeking employment, shall be entitled to receive unemployment compensation benefits for a maximum benefit period of twenty-six weeks in an amount not less than \$17.00 per week nor more than 50% of the statewide average weekly wage as determined annually by the Washington State Department of Employment Security, under the conditions established in and as more fully described in C.F. 280329. An employee who has been on leave of absence during the year immediately prior to layoff shall be deemed in continuous employment immediately preceding such layoff for purposes of eligibility for unemployment compensation benefits as provided herein but such leave time when taken without pay shall not be included

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in the computation of the one-year requirement. The Director of Personnel is hereby authorized and directed to administer said unemployment compensation program, and in such connection may promulgate administrative regulations from time to time in the manner provided in the Administrative Code (Ordinance 102228) to carry out the intent and purpose of this ordinance. Said Director is further authorized to contract for necessary consulting services, for reinsurance, and for such other services as may be necessary from time to time to administer the unemployment compensation program.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section.....<sup>2</sup>. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.



**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance 10483 is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. A program of unemployment compensation is hereby established for eligible employees of The City of Seattle, including all such eligible employees of the Seattle Public Library upon adoption by the Board of Trustees of the Seattle Public Library of a resolution providing therefor. Employees whose service and pay are interrupted by layoff for lack of work or funds after November 1, 1974, including temporary employees, and who were employed full time by the City continuously for a period of one year immediately preceding such layoff, and who are not excluded by Section 2 of this ordinance and who provide evidence that they are available for and are actively seeking employment, shall be entitled to receive unemployment compensation benefits for a maximum benefit period of twenty-six weeks in an amount not less than \$17.00 per week nor more than 50% of the statewide average weekly wage as determined annually by the Washington State Department of Employment Security, under the conditions established in and as more fully described in C. F. 25022. AN EMPLOYEE WHO HAS BEEN ON LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING THE YEAR IMMEDIATELY PRIOR TO LAYOFF SHALL BE DEEMED IN CONTINUING EMPLOYMENT IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING SUCH LAYOFF FOR PURPOSES OF ELIGIBILITY FOR UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION BENEFITS AS PROVIDED HEREIN BUT SUCH LEAVE TIME WHICH TAKEN WITHOUT PAY SHALL NOT BE INCLUDED IN THE COMPUTATION OF THE ONE-YEAR REQUIREMENT. The Director of Personnel is hereby authorized and directed to administer said unemployment compensation program and in such connection may promulgate administrative regulations from time to time in the manner provided in the Administrative Code (Ordinance 10222) to carry out the intent and purpose of this ordinance. Said Director is further authorized to contract for necessary consulting services, for reinsurance, and for such other services as may be necessary from time to time to administer the unemployment compensation program.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
