AN ORDINANCE relating to the proposed new City Charter and the proposed alternative Section 420 thereof prepared by the Board of Freeholders; submitting the same to the qualified electors (voters) of The City of Seattle at the general municipal election to be held therein on November 4, 1975 and requiring the City Clerk to certify to the Director of the Department of Records and Elections of King County specified ballot titles therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there be submitted to the qualified electors (voters) of The City of Seattle at the general municipal election to be held therein on November 4, 1975, for their adoption or rejection, the proposed new Charter prepared and filed with the City Comptroller and ex-officio City Clerk on the 3rd day of April, 1975, (C.F. 281277) by the freeholders chosen at the general municipal election of March 26, 1974, and that there also be submitted at said election a proposition for the adoption or rejection by said electors of an alternative Section 420 of said proposed new Charter to provide for election of six councilmembers from districts and for election of three councilmembers at large instead of electing all such councilmembers at large, which alternative Section 420 was prepared as an alternative proposition by said freeholders and filed with the City Comptroller and ex-officio City Clerk on the 3rd day of April, 1975.

Section 2. Adoption or rejection of said new Charter shall be voted upon in the following manner: There shall be placed upon the ballot a statement in substantially the following form:

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"Proposed Seattle Charter

Shall the proposed new Charter for The
City of Seattle (C.F. 281277) prepared by the
Board of Freeholders be adopted?

For the proposed charter _____
Against the proposed charter _____"

Every qualified elector (voter) at such election
desiring to vote in favor of the approval and adoption of
said proposed new Charter shall vote ballots containing
the words "For the proposed charter". Every qualified
elector (voter) desiring to vote for the rejection of said
proposed new Charter shall vote ballots containing the words
"Against the proposed charter".

Section 3. The proposition for the adoption or rejection
of alternative Section 420 of the proposed new Charter shall
be voted upon separately in the following manner: There
shall be placed upon the ballot, a statement of said proposition
in substantially the following form:

"Alternative Charter Section

Shall six councilmembers be elected from districts
and three be elected at large (Alternate Section 420), instead
of all councilmembers being elected at large?

For alternative section 420 of the proposed charter _____
Against alternative section 420 of the proposed charter
_____"

Every qualified elector (voter) at such election
desiring to vote in favor of the approval and adoption of
said alternative Section 420 of the proposed new Charter
shall vote ballots containing the words "For alternative
section 420 of the proposed charter". Every qualified elector
(voter) desiring to vote for the rejection of said alterna-
tive Section 420 shall vote ballots containing the words

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"Against alternative section 420 of the proposed charter".

Section 4. Upon approval of this ordinance by the Mayor and not less than forty-five (45) days before the date of such election, the City Clerk shall certify to the Director of the Department of Records and Elections of King County as Supervisor of Elections, such proposed new City Charter and proposition for said alternative Section 420 in the form of ballot titles conforming to the foregoing statements of the same.

Section...5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
