ORDINANCE 105680

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City's Community Development Block Grant Program for the Grant Program Year commencing July 1, 1976 through June 30, 1977; accepting financial assistance from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development; authorizing implementation of certain projects by the Executive Department - Law and Justice Planning and Office of Policy Planning, Department of Parks and Recreation, Department of Community Development, Public Health Department, Department of Buildings, Department of Engineering and Department of Human Resources; providing for implementation of certain projects through agreements with the Seattle Housing Authority; making a reimbursable appropriation from the Emergency Fund and declaring the emergency therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That as of July 1, 1976, as requested by the Director of the Department of Community Development and recommended by the Mayor in the materials attached hereto, upon receipt by the City of the "Notice of Grant Award" from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development in connection with the application for financial assistance under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-383, 88 Stat. 633), made by the City pursuant to Resolution 25185 for the program year July 1, 1976 through June 30, 1977, said grant award is hereby accepted and funds received pursuant thereto shall be deposited in the Housing and Community Development Revenue Sharing Fund established by Ordinance 104195; and the Mayor is further authorized to make, for and on behalf of The City of Seattle, all assurances, promises, representations and consent to suit specified in said application and to comply with any applicable regulations of the United States relating to implementation of the program contemplated in Resolution 25185; and the Mayor is further directed and designated as the authorized representative of the City to supply such other documents and information

as may be required in connection with said program and its implementation.

Section 2. That as soon after July 1, 1976 as written permission is issued therefor by the Mayor or his designee in accordance with regulations of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, upon receipt by the City of the "Notice of Grant Award" from said United States agency, subject to and consistent with the Constitution and laws of the State of Washington, and the Charter of The City of Seattle, and to implement the program contemplated in the application authorized by Resolution 25185, the following-designated departments are authorized to implement the named projects and activities at a total cost not to exceed the funding levels indicated subject to the provisions of Section 3 hereof.

and to further implement the program contemplated in the application authorized by Resolution 25185, the Mayor is authorized to enter into for and on behalf of The City of Seattle such agreement or agreements as may be necessary with the Seattle Housing Authority for implementation of the following projects and activities at a total cost not to exceed the funding levels indicated below:

and for all such purposes the sum of Ten Million One Hundred Five Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$10,105,750) is hereby appropriated from the Emergency Fund, which shall be reimbursed by the appropriation and transfer, hereby made and authorized, of a like sum from the Housing and Community Development Revenue Sharing Fund established by Ordinance 104195 upon receipt and deposit in such latter fund of the moneys accepted in Section 1 hereof, and the City Comptroller is authorized to draw and the City Treasurer to pay the necessary warrants and make the necessary transfers.

Section 3. That the Mayor or his designee is authorized to reallocate such funds among projects approved in Council Resolution 25185 as necessary, provided that the sum of such changes shall not exceed One Million Fifty-seven Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$1,057,100), such sum equalling 10% of the grant entitlement, and further provided that the Mayor

or his designee notify in writing the Chairman of the Planning and Urban Development Committee of the nature of and the reasons for the reallocation of any portion of an individual project budget exceeding 10% or Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000), whichever is the greater, of the same project budget established in Council Resolution 25185 prior to such reallocation; and further provided that the Mayor or his designee report in writing to the City Council on a quarterly basis the nature and amount of such reallocations.

Section 4. That in order to secure the release of federal funds available to the City under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-383), the Mayor is hereby authorized to discharge all responsibilities as may be required by federal regulations and laws concerning the environment and to consent to assume the status of a "responsible federal official" under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA), insofar as the provisions of NEPA apply to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), for environmental review, decision-making and action assumed and carried out by The City of Seattle, and by approving this ordinance the Mayor so consents. By so consenting, the Mayor shall assume the responsibilities, where applicable, for the conduct of environmental reviews, decision-making, and action as to environmental issues, preparation and circulation of draft and final environmental impact statements, and assumption of lead agency responsibilities for preparation of such statements on behalf of agencies of the United States other than HUD, where such other agencies consent to such assumption; and the Mayor in his official

2 capacity is further authorized to consent, personally, and  
3 on behalf of The City of Seattle, to accept the jurisdiction  
4 of the Federal Courts for the enforcement of all responsibilities  
5 referred to herein.

6 Section 5. That in implementing all projects involving  
7 street rights-of-way, the City Engineer is authorized to  
8 prepare plans, specifications, and cost estimates, hire  
9 consultants, and to proceed under the direction of the Board  
10 of Public Works with the construction of said improvements  
11 which improvements may be effected by the awarding of a  
12 contract or contracts therefor, or the same or any part  
13 thereof by day labor, in the discretion of said Board,  
subject to applicable state law.


14 Section 6. That any act pursuant to the authority and  
15 prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby  
16 ratified and confirmed.

17 Section 7. WHEREAS, the appropriation herein made is  
18 to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City for which  
19 no appropriation has been made due to causes which could not  
20 reasonably have been foreseen at the time of making the 1976  
21 Budget; Now, Therefore, in accordance with RCW 35.32A.060,  
22 by reason of the facts above stated and the emergency which  
23 is hereby declared to exist, this ordinance shall become  
24 effective immediately upon the approval or signing of the  
same by the Mayor or passage over his veto, as provided by  
the Charter of the City.





SUBJECT: Transmittal of a draft ordinance for the implementation of the 1976-1977 Community Development Block Grant Program

The second year Community Development Block Grant Program will commence on July 1, 1976. Due to the time frame of the Block Grant program it is requested that this Ordinance be considered as soon as possible. The emergency clause in the Ordinance will permit the legislation to take effect immediately upon its Executive approval.

The attached draft Ordinance appropriates the City's Community Development Block Grant funds to projects, as specified in Resolution 25185. The Ordinance also designates the Departmental division of responsibility for project implementation and it assigns the Mayor and the City Engineer certain responsibilities for the 1976-1977 Block Grant Program year.

Please be aware of the fact that Resolution 25185 includes in its total the entire portion of the first year reprogrammed funds (\$848,000). According to Seattle's second year application to HUD \$335,750 is to be carried over into the second year. The Resolution therefore presents a distorted picture of the second year funded projects by including, without benefit of explanation, the following projects and amounts:

In actuality the \$200,000 for Burke Gilman is to be paid from first year funds and should not be appropriated again. The Urban Renewal amount should be \$1,800,000 with the \$300,000 difference being the 1st year funds which were reprogrammed and spent on Livingston-Baker. Trans-Aid has also been erroneously apportioned \$49,000 when actually only \$36,750 was intended to come from second year funds, \$12,250 having been reprogrammed to it from the first year.

A summary of the reprogrammed amounts and their relation to the attached project Ordinance is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Community Development Block Grant, authorizing the implementation of certain projects connected therewith and designating certain departments as responsible for the operation of said projects, authorizing the Mayor to carry out certain responsibilities under the National Environmental Protection Act, authorizing the City Engineer to effect public improvements in certain City street right-of-ways, making a reimbursable appropriation from the Emergency Fund and declaring the emergency therefore.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That in order to implement the second year Community Development Block Grant Program, subject to and consistent with the State Constitution and laws, and the Charter of the City of Seattle and in accordance with the projects and activities approved by the Seattle City Council in Resolution 25185, the following designated departments are authorized to implement the projects and activities listed in this Section at the dollar levels indicated effective July 1, 1976, or as soon thereafter as written permission is issued by the Mayor or his designee:

and for such purposes the sum of Ten Million, One Hundred and Five Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$10,105,750) or so much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated from the Emergency Fund, which shall be reimbursed by the appropriation and transfer, hereby made and authorized, of a like sum from the Housing and Community Development Revenue Sharing Fund established by Ordinance 104195 when there are deposited in said latter fund the monies accepted and to be received pursuant to that certain grant agreement with the United States of America, Department of Housing and Urban Development, authorized by Ordinance 104700, and the City Comptroller is authorized to draw and the City Treasurer to pay the necessary warrants and make the necessary transfers.

Section 2. That the Mayor or his designee is authorized to reallocate such funds among projects approved in Council Resolution 25185 as necessary provided that the sum of such changes not exceed One Million, Sixty One Thousand, and Eight Hundred dollars (\$1,061,800), such sum equalling 10% of the grant entitlement, and further provided that the Mayor or his designee notify in writing the Chairman of the Planning and Urban Development Committee of the nature of and the reasons for the reallocation of any portion of an individual project budget exceeding 10% or Twenty Five Thousand dollars (\$25,000), whichever is the greater, of the same project budget, established in Council Resolution 25185 prior to such reallocation; and further provided that the Mayor or his designee report in writing to the City Council on a quarterly basis the nature and amount of such reallocations;

Section 3. That the Mayor is authorized to assume and discharge all responsibilities as may be required by federal regulations for environmental review for the Block Grant under the National Environmental Protection Act and other applicable laws;

Section 4. That for all projects implemented by the Engineering Department which involve City street right-of-ways, the City Engineer is authorized to prepare plans, specifications and costs estimates, to hire consultants as needed, and thereafter to proceed under the direction of the Board of Public Works with the construction of, which improvement may be effected by the awarding of a contract or contracts therefore or the same or a part thereof may be effected by day labor in the discretion of said Board, in accordance with State law;

Section 5. That the execution of agreements authorized herein and any other act pursuant to the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance are hereby ratified and confirmed;

Section 6. WHEREAS, the appropriation herein made is to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City for which no appropriation has been made due to causes which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the making the 1976 Budget; Now, Therefore, in accordance with RCW 35.34A.060, by reason of the facts above stated and the emergency which is hereby declared to exist, this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the approval or signing of the same by the Mayor or passage over his veto, as provided by the Charter of the City.


