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ORDINANCE 105724

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Indian Cultural Center at Discovery Park; authorizing the execution of a memorandum of understanding with the United Indians of All Tribes Foundation in connection therewith; authorizing the acceptance of grant funds from the United States of America Economic Development Administration for financial assistance for the construction of an Indian Center at Discovery Park; making a reimbursable appropriation from the Emergency Fund and declaring the Emergency therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation is hereby authorized to execute for and on behalf of the City, an agreement with the United Indians of All Tribes Foundation (UIATF) substantially in the form entitled "Memorandum of Understanding" a copy of which is attached hereto, which memorandum defines the roles of the City and the UIATF during the construction of the Arts and Crafts component of the Indian Cultural Center at Discovery Park and authorizes the City to accept and disburse funds granted by the United States of America Economic Development Administration (EDA) to the UIATF for the construction of said Indian Cultural Center, and the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation is hereby authorized to act as the City's representative in connection with said Memorandum of Understanding, all as recommended by the Mayor and requested by the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation in the materials attached hereto.

Section 2. That in implementation of the Memorandum of Understanding authorized in Section 1 hereof, the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation is hereby authorized to accept, for and on behalf of the City, financial assistance in the amount of Three Hundred Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$312,000) granted to the UIATF by the EDA for the development of the

13 to draw and the City Treasurer to pay the necessary warrants  
14 and make the necessary transfers.



27 the Charter of the City.



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Defining the respective roles of the United Indians of All Tribes Foundation ("UIATF") and the City of Seattle ("City") during the construction of the Indian Cultural Center Arts and Crafts Building at Discovery Park.

OVER-ALL GOALS STATEMENT

The Indian Cultural Center at Discovery Park is a project being carried out by the City of Seattle in conjunction with the UIATF and will ultimately become a repository of Indian culture that is of national significance and a significant element of Discovery Park. The first phase of the Indian Cultural Center is the construction of an Arts and Crafts Building. Consistent with the agreements between the City and UIATF, as authorized in the basic agreement (Ordinance 100777), and that covenant authorized by Ordinance 103194 the City and UIATF agree to assist each other in expeditious development of the Cultural Center.

The spirit of this Memorandum of Understanding recognizes the contribution of each of the parties to the project. The United Indians of All Tribes Foundation will provide for the City's benefit an operating Indian Cultural and Educational Center located in Discovery Park. The City is contributing land which is leased to the UIATF and \$500,000 towards the cultural center and the administration of the agreement authorized by Ordinance 103194, together with project support. The UIATF agrees to operate these properties in a manner consistent with all terms and conditions of the Lease Agreement between the City and the UIATF dated November 6, 1975 and all other pertinent memorandums of understanding which do presently or shall in future pertain to these properties.

DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVES

To facilitate coordination and cooperation between the parties, each of the parties will name a designated representative who will serve as prime communicator and project liaison. The designated representative for UIATF will be

responsible for the day-to-day business of the project and will be the prime communicator with the UIATF Executive Director and Board for project decisions. The City's designated representative will be the prime communicator with the Department of Parks and Recreation and the City and shall act as the project liaison with the Seattle Design Commission and all City departments. The designated City representative shall expedite project review through the Department of Parks and Recreation and all other concerned City departments. Nothing herein will require or preclude payment of the direct costs of the designated representatives, should project funds be available in the project budget and the parties both agree in writing that they shall be used for said payment.

#### PROJECT SCHEDULE

The two designated representatives shall, within sixty (60) days from the date of this agreement, prepare an overall project master schedule providing for construction, if such has not already been prepared, which after review and adoption by the parties, shall be used as a management guide and be adhered to as nearly as possible until such time as it is officially updated by agreement of both parties.

#### PROJECT RESPONSIBILITIES

(A) Design Services: The United Indians of All Tribes Foundation shall be responsible for the contracting of the design services under the direction of the Superintendent of the Department of Parks and Recreation and the City hereby approves such contracts already let out by the UIATF. The City, through the Superintendent of the Department of Parks and Recreation, shall direct design, provide design review and approval services, and shall otherwise participate in the design phase of the project.

(B) Design Commission Review The design-development and construction phases of this project will be undertaken

by the Department of Parks and Recreation pursuant to its normal procedures. The City-designated representative shall schedule project reviews with the Seattle Design Commission at the completion of each of the following design phases: design development and construction documents. The City representative shall consult with and notify the UIATF representative regarding the exact time scheduling for project reviews. The Design Commission has previously reviewed and approved the schematic design phase. The UIATF shall provide information and materials to the Design Commission and participate as needed in its reviews.

(C) City Department Reviews: The Department of Parks and Recreation shall carry out review of this project consistent with normal Parks Department procedures including but not limited to formation of a design team to review and approve all schematics, construction drawings and specifications. The Parks and Recreation Department Review Committee shall review the schematic, design development, and construction document phases prior to review by the Seattle Design Commission. The Board of Public Works shall review and approve all project documents and plans prior to execution per their normal procedure. Project review by the Parks and Recreation Department will be made at no cost to the project.

(D) Administrative Costs: Costs incurred by the City and UIATF in administering and reviewing this project, unless required by ordinance shall not be costs of the project. Where required by ordinance, the cost of necessary project reviews by City departments and the Seattle Design Commission shall be assessed at normal rates and nothing herein shall preclude waiver of said costs by any City department or agency authorized to do so.

(E) Economic Development Administration Funds: The City recognizes that UIATF has obtained a direct grant in the sum of \$312,000 from the Economic Development Administration

("EDA") for construction of the Arts and Crafts Center. The City will receive and disburse the EDA funds and the parties shall coordinate their efforts to facilitate administration of EDA project funds by the City. Implementation of administration of EDA funds by the City shall depend upon ultimate agreement between UIATF, the City and EDA. The City agrees to process EDA funds at no extra cost to the project.

(F) Disbursement of City Funds: To the extent City funds are involved, project expenditures will be paid on City warrants authorized by Department of Parks and Recreation vouchers. It normally requires three to four weeks to process a voucher and issue a warrant from the time an invoice is submitted. In special cases, the time from submittal of the voucher to issuance of the warrant will be expedited by the City so that the voucher is processed and the warrant paid within twenty-four (24) hours of submittal. It is expected, however, that nearly all bills will be paid by the normal procedure.

(G) Approval of Project Expenditures: Prior to approval of invoices regarding equipment, materials, supplies or services, the designated representative of the Department of Parks and Recreation shall solicit the advice, assistance and consultation of the UIATF designated representative with regard to such invoices. The Department of Parks and Recreation designated representative will perform the City review to approve payment, and will be responsible for arranging expeditious processing of project invoices. The City recognizes that "in-kind services" (labor and materials) may be part of the project. The City agrees that it will not object to the use of such donated material or labor, provided that all materials and procedures are acceptable to the City and comply with code requirements and all labor and services comply with applicable law.

(H) Permits, Fees, Taxes and Licenses: Both parties recognize that the project will require ordinary construction permits and may require other fees, taxes or licenses; where such are required by ordinance or other law, the cost shall be paid with project funds.

(I) Bidding: The basic bid documents will be prepared by the architect and submitted for approval to the Board of Public Works. The parties recognize that bid documents must comply with City and EDA requirements and undertake to coordinate their efforts to develop compatible documents. Contracts for project construction shall be awarded by the Board of Public Works through its normal process, and contracts for the purchase of project materials, equipment or supplies shall be awarded by the City Purchasing Agent through its normal process. However, it is expressly recognized that certain unique features of this project may result in special bid requirements, and the City will undertake to facilitate said requirements to the full extent allowed by law.

#### AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

The parties recognize that because of the unique nature of this project it would be desirable to encourage use of Indian labor where possible. Therefore, when applicable, the City agrees to cooperate with UIATF to the extent allowed by law, in facilitating the over-all objective of using qualified Indian labor on this project.

#### ARBITRATION REMEDIES

Any controversy or claim between the parties arising out of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be resolved

through the mechanism provided by the Agreement dated March 16, 1972, as authorized by Ordinance 100777.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This agreement shall be effective as of December 2, 1974.



In April of 1974, the City Council appropriated \$500,000 from the Emergency Fund (Ordinance 103194) to support design and construction of an Indian Cultural Center at Discovery Park. This project is being administered in cooperation with the United Indians of All Tribes Foundation, as provided for in the attached City-UIATF Memorandum of Understanding. We are herewith requesting that execution of this Memorandum by the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation be ratified and confirmed in conjunction with the legislation requested below. Pursuant to the authority granted by Ordinance 104453, the City is presently negotiating an agreement with the UIATF which expands upon the Memorandum and assigns both agencies certain administrative responsibilities to assure the smooth implementation of this cooperative project.

Ordinance 104453 further authorizes the Department of Parks and Recreation to act as fiscal agent for the administration of U.S. Economic Development Administration grant funds awarded to the UIATF for development of the Indian Cultural Center. The E.D.A. grant award equals \$312,000, or approximately 35% of the \$874,000 total project cost. Because the grant is paid on a reimbursement basis at the 35% ratio, the City must expend the total \$874,000 project budget in order to receive reimbursement of the full grant amount. Funds available to the City for expenditure on this project originally totaled \$562,000, consisting of the \$500,000 Emergency Fund contribution mentioned above and \$62,000 in Community Development Block Grant Funds.

An appropriation of \$312,000 is necessary to increase the level of expenditure authority to \$874,000, enabling full project expenditure and subsequent receipt of the full E.D.A. grant amount. The Emergency Fund would be incrementally reimbursed for this appropriation at frequent intervals. To date \$69,800 has been received by the City as the initial grant reimbursement and is on deposit in the City Treasurer's Clearing Fund pending its transfer to the Emergency Fund. The E.D.A. has pledged its ongoing support and cooperation in expediting this reimbursement process. Presently, a second reimbursement from E.D.A. has been requested and a third is being prepared. While the Emergency Fund will

be substantially reimbursed as construction proceeds towards the estimated completion date of 1 October 1976, 100% reimbursement must await conclusion of a federal audit and therefore may be delayed for approximately six months following completion of construction.

It is requested that Ordinance 103194 be amended to appropriate an additional \$312,000 from the Emergency Fund and to provide authority for the City to accept into the Emergency Fund such monies as may be made available through the E.D.A. Grant.

Attached please find a draft of the requested legislation, as well as that additional information required pursuant to the City S.O.P. #100-014. To insure the continued success of this cooperative effort, we ask that this legislative request be processed as expeditiously as possible. ## LEGISLATIVE REQUEST STATEMENT 100 - 014

In conformance with City of Seattle Standard Operating Procedure 100-014, the following information is submitted:

### Section 1 - Title of Program or Proposal

Indian Cultural Center: Discovery Park  
Amendments to Ordinance 103194

### Section 2 - Statement of Objectives

Consistent with the City's policy of cooperation and assistance in the development of the Daybreak Star component of the Indian Cultural Center at Discovery Park (Ordinance 104042, 103194, 104453), this legislation will effect the following administrative actions to further this project:

1. Execution of the attached Memorandum of Understanding will be ratified and confirmed. It is partly on the basis of this Memorandum that the UIATF was awarded a grant of \$312,000 from the EDA for the construction of this facility within Discovery Park.
2. A fully reimbursable appropriation of \$. 312,000 from the Emergency Fund will be made such that the City is able to expend the total \$874,000 project cost and subsequently receive reimbursement of the total grant amount. The City's administration of the UIATF's grant funds from the EDA is authorized by Ordinance 104453.
3. Authority for the City to accept into the Emergency Fund those funds to be received from the UIATF in reimbursement of this appropriation will allow for the ongoing incremental reimbursement of the Fund.

### Section 3 - Fiscal Requirements

Funds available to the City for expenditure on this project total \$631,800, including a \$500,000 City contribution, \$62,000 in CDBG funds, and the initial EDA-UIATF grant reimbursement of \$69,800. The EDA grant of \$312,000 totals approximately 35% of the total project cost of \$874,000 and will be paid on a reimbursement basis at the 35% ratio. Thus, to be eligible for full grant reimbursement, the City must expend the total project cost of \$874,000. The \$312,000 Emergency Fund appropriation and deposit of the \$69,800 requested here would enable the City's uninterrupted project administration and expenditure, and subsequent grant reimbursement via the UIATF of the full grant amount.

### Section 4 - Personnel Requirements

Fiscal administration of this project will be conducted by staff within the Department of Parks and Recreation: No new personnel will be required.

Section 5 - Facilities and Equipment Requirements

Construction will be accomplished under contract and no new facilities or equipment will be required for fiscal administration of the project.

Section 6 - Evaluation Criteria and Reporting

Reports on the fiscal administration of this project will be made available to City Council upon request.

Section 7 - Alternatives

There is no apparent alternative which could insure continued and unimpeded progress on this project.

The City representative shall consult with and notify the PIATF representative regarding the exact time scheduling for project reviews. The Design Commission has previously reviewed and approved the schematic design phase.

(B) Parks and Recreation Department Review: The Parks and Recreation Department Review Committee shall be chaired by the Director of Facility, Design and Implementation, the Park Engineer and the Director of Horticulture. The Parks and Recreation Department Review Committee shall review the design

development and construction documents prepared by the Seattle Design Commission. The Parks and Recreation Department Review Committee shall function in an advisory and informational role and shall not have authority to unilaterally change design documents or veto design proposals. Project review by the Parks and Recreation Department will be made at no cost to the project.

(C) Administrative Costs: Except where required by ordinance, the costs of all necessary project reviews by City departments and other costs incurred by the City in administration of this project shall not be costs of the project. Where required by ordinance, the cost of necessary project reviews by City departments shall be assessed at normal rates and nothing herein shall preclude waiver of said costs by any City department or agency.

(D) Economic Development Administration Funds: The City recognizes that UIATP has obtained a direct grant in the sum of \$250,000 from the Economic Development Administration ("EDA") for construction of the Arts and Crafts Center. The City will receive and disburse the EDA funds and the parties shall coordinate their efforts to facilitate administration of EDA project funds by the City. Implementation of administration of EDA funds by the City shall depend upon ultimate agreement between UIATP, the City and EDA. The City agrees to process EDA funds at no extra cost to the project.

(E) Disbursement of City Funds: To the degree that City funds are involved, project expenditures will be paid on City warrants authorized by Parks and Recreation Department vouchers. The parties recognize that because of the unique nature of this project it would be desirable to encourage use of Indian

labor where possible. Therefore, the City agrees to cooperate with UIATF, to the extent allowed by law, in facilitating the overall objective of using qualified Indian labor on this project.

## ORDINANCE

1 AN ORDINANCE relating to the National Indian Cultural and Education Center in  
2 Discovery Park, amending Section 1 of Ordinance 103194 to ratify and  
3 confirm a Memorandum of Understanding with the United Indians of All  
4 Tribes Foundation defining the roles of the UIATF and the City during  
5 construction of the Indian Cultural Center Arts and Crafts Building; to  
6 make a \$312,000 reimbursable appropriation from the Emergency Fund in  
7 connection therewith, declaring the emergency therefor and authorizing  
8 acceptance into the Emergency Fund of monies to be received from the  
9 UIATF as reimbursement therefor.

10 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

11 Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance 103194 is amended to read as  
12 follows:

13 Section 1. The Mayor, on the advice and with consultation of the  
14 Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, is hereby authorized for and on behalf  
15 of the City of Seattle to execute and deliver an agreement with the United  
16 Indians of All Tribes Foundation to assist in establishing an Indian Cultural  
17 Center at Discovery Park, which will effect a grant agreement by the afore-  
18 said Foundation with the United States of America Economic Development  
19 Administration and will conform with planning for the development of  
20 Discovery Park by the Department of Parks and Recreation; and the execution  
21 by the Superintendent of the Department of Parks and Recreation of a Memorandum  
22 of Understanding with the United Indians of All Tribes Foundation (UIATF)  
23 defining the respective roles of the UIATF and the City of Seattle during the  
24 construction of the Arts and Crafts Building component of said Cultural  
25 Center is hereby ratified and confirmed, and the Superintendent of the  
26 Department of Parks and Recreation is authorized to act as the representative  
27 of the City in connection with the Memorandum of Understanding herein ratified  
28 and confirmed; and for such purpose and to provide for such Cultural Center and  
the administration of said agreement by the Department of Parks and Recreation,  
the sum of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000), or so much thereof as may be  
necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Emergency Fund, all as recommended  
by the Mayor and the Budget Director in C.F. 278622; and further, to carry out  
the legislative intent of Ordinance 104453 and to provide for such Cultural  
Center and the fiscal administration of the project by the Department of Parks and

Recreation the sum of \$312,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Emergency Fund, to be fully reimbursed by the UIATF with U.S. Economic Development Administration grant-in-aid funds which have been awarded to the UIATF pursuant to the above acts for this project identified as E.D.A. Project Number 07-11-01496, with authorization provided herewith for deposit of said funds from the UIATF into the City's Emergency Fund.

Section 2. WHEREAS the \$312,000 appropriation made herein is to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City for which no appropriation has been made due to causes which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of making the 1976 Budget; Now, Therefore, in accordance with RCW 35.32A.000, by reason of the facts above stated and the emergency which is hereby declared to exist, this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the approval or signing of the same by the Mayor or passage over his veto, as provided by the Charter of the City.
