1 106053 ORDINANCE 2 AN ORDINANCE designating as a Landmark Old Fire Station 3 No. 33 at 10235 - 62nd Avenue South, specifying the particular features to be preserved in accordance with the Landmarks Preservation Ordinance (102229). a WHEREAS, Ordinance 102229 created the Landmarks Preserva-5 tion Board and established a procedure for the designation and preservation of structures and areas having 6 historical, cultural, architectural, engineering or geographical importance; and 7 WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 102229 and due notice, the 8 Landmarks Preservation Board, after a public hearing held on March 19, 1975 considered (a) the evidence and 9 testimony presented at such hearing, including the Seattle Historical Building Data Sheet in C.F. 283713, and (b) the conformance or lack of conformance of the 10 proposed designation with the Comprehensive Plan of Seattle and with the purposes and standards of Ordinance 11 102229, and based upon such evidence and consideration determined that Old Fire Station No. 33 situated upon 12 Lots 9 and 10, Block 1, Fern Hill Addition to Rainier Beach at 10235 62nd Avenue South satisfies each of the following criteria required under Ordinance 102229 for 13 designation of a Landmark: 14 Section 6 (1) has significant character, interest or value, as part of the development, heritage or culture characteristics of the City, State or Nation; or is associated with the life of a person significant in the 15 16 past; 17 Section 6 (5) embodies those distinguishing characteristics of an architectural-type or engineering 18 specimen; and recommended to the City Council that the Old Fire 19 Station No. 33 be designated a Landmark and that certain features thereof should be preserved; and 20 WHEREAS, the Planning and Urban Development Committee of the City Council considered the report and recommenda-21 tion of the Landmarks Preservation Board at a public hearing held July 21, 1976 pursuant to due notice, and 22 reported to the City Council in favor of such recommendation; 23 Now, Therefore, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS: 24 That the attached report and recommendations Section 1. 25 of the Landmark Preservation Board are hereby approved and 26 Old Fire Station No.33 situated upon Lots 9 and 10, Block 1, 27 Fern Hill Addition to Rainier Beach at 10235 62nd Avenue

South is hereby designated a Landmark having a special character or special historical, cultural, architectural, engineering or geographic interest or value, based upon characteristics specified in the attached report and recommendations of the Landmarks Preservation Board and the Secretary of the Landmarks Preservation Board is hereby directed to send to the owner of record of the property designated, by registered or certified mail, and to the Superintendent of Buildings, a copy of this ordinance and a letter outlining the basis for such designation and the obligations and restrictions which result from such designation within ten days after approval of this ordinance by the Mayor.

Section 2. That the following particular features of the landmark designated in Section 1 above shall be preserved.

(a) The exterior of the building including its painting.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 3.... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
