AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Human Resources; authorizing the Director to establish and collect fees for the use of P-patch garden plots by program participants.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. To partially offset the costs of the P-patch program, the Director of the Department of Human Resources is authorized by rules adopted in accordance with the Administrative Code of The City of Seattle (Ordinance 102228) to establish and collect fees for the use of P-patch garden plots. Fees shall be established in accordance with the size of garden plot used by program participants and shall be no lower than the following:

10' x 20' plots

\$10.00 per year

10' x 40' plots

\$15.00 per year

Section 2. Revenue received from the fees imposed pursuant to Section 1 of this ordinance shall be deposited in the Human Resources Operating Fund.


