AN ORDINANCE repealing Ordinances 106089, 106169 and 106327 which provide for the registration of bicycles.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance 106089, entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE relating to the registration of bicycles; defining offenses and providing penalties, and providing for a Bicycle Safety Education Program in connection therewith."

and Ordinance 106169, entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE relating to the registration of bicycles; amending Sections 1, 3, 5, 6, and 9 of Ordinance 106089 to provide for the performance of certain administrative functions by the Chief of Police, and ratifying and confirming prior acts."

and Ordinance 106327, entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE relating to the registration of bicycles; amending Sections 3, 5, 12 of Ordinance 106089; extending the period for bicycle registration; authorizing bicycle dealers to sell registration certificates and reducing the fine for violation of the ordinance."

are hereby repealed.

Dear Phyllis:

The mandatory bicycle registration program has apparently still failed to register even a majority of the estimated number of bicycles in Seattle. Understandably, the Police Department does not wish to be placed in the position of stopping cyclists and issuing citations. The result is a tolerance policy on bicycle registration.

I believe the positive aspects of the program can be preserved by returning to a well-publicized voluntary program without the excessive government regulation imposed by the mandatory program.

Attached is a draft ordinance repealing the current program for introduction and referral to the Public Safety and Justice Committee. A second ordinance may be drafted later, following the committee's desires with respect to the voluntary program.

Also attached is a copy of a letter to Police Chief Robert Hanson, requesting updated information on program performance.






