Dear Ms. McFarlane:

On November 6, 1978 at the suggestion of Mr. Emmett Watson I requested that the Street Naming Committee of the Board of Public Works consider renaming Occidental Avenue South (from South Jackson Street to South King Street) in memory of Royal Brougham.

In investigating this request it became evident that this was inappropriate because of various reasons. The Street Naming Committee's staff then explored the possibility of renaming Second Avenue South Extension. Again, there were possible objections.

Since that time I have contacted the officers of the Pioneer Square Association, the International District Improvement Association (Inter-Im), the International District Economic Association, as well as the management of the Kingdome and property owners along South Connecticut Street regarding the possibility of renaming that street (from Airport Way South to Alaskan Way South) in memory of Royal Brougham.

I have received letters of support from Michael J. Sullivan, the President of the Pioneer Square Association, from Robert N. Santos, the Executive Director of the International District Improvement Association (Inter-Im), and Ron A. Mamiya, President of the International District Economic Association. Copies of those letters are enclosed. I have also received indications of support from the management of the Kingdome and others.

South Connecticut Street is an excellent opportunity for the following reasons, among others:

1. I believe there are only two addresses on this portion of South Connecticut Street;
2. The street is very suitable for a boulevard designation -- with street improvements, street trees, and sidewalks already completed;
3. The street is adjacent to the front entrance of the Kingdome and is completely compatible; and
4. When the freeway access is completed it would be an appropriate designation for these ramps from the north, south and east.

I urge that you now consider this new request in light of the support of so many groups and individuals.

Honorable Members:

The Board of Public Works had before it, in regular session today, a report and recommendation from its Street Naming Committee on the request of Councilman George Benson to rename South Connecticut Street in memory of Royal Brougham.

Councilman Benson submitted several letters of support from local agencies favoring the street naming change, as well as receiving support from the management of the Kingdoms. Only one building is currently addressed off South Connecticut Street. The owner and tenants of this building were contacted and they did not raise any objections to the proposed street naming change.

South Connecticut Street is approximately 100 feet wide and extends from Alaskan Way South to Airport Way South (East Roadway). South Connecticut Street is located within the south area of the City's street designation system. This is the only area in the City that is named "Connecticut". There is a possibility that freeway access ramps may be developed in the future, providing freeway access to and from South Connecticut Street.

If the name of South Connecticut Street were changed, the following factors should be considered:

1. The City's street designation system requires that all roadways flowing in an east-west direction in the south area have a "S." or "South" prefix.
2. The City's street designation system classifies a "Street" as a road flowing in a generally east-west grid line. "Boulevard", "Parkway", "Way", "Drive", and "Road" are primarily diagonal or curvilinear roadways angling through the grid pattern. Although South Connecticut Street is properly classified as a "Street", the designation of "Way" would be preferred for this street naming proposal, because "Way" would denote a special roadway, named in memory of Royal Brougham. A "Way" is usually a winding or angular roadway, but a "Way" can be parallel to the grid system. "Boulevard" or "Parkway" would not be appropriate designation for this street naming proposal because "Boulevard" or "Parkway" denote park-like areas. South Connecticut Street is located in an industrial area of the City.



3. The cost of replacing existing South Connecticut Street street signs and overhead destination signs would be approximately \$5,000. This money would come from the Engineering Department's budget. Some time and expense would also be involved in notifying over 30 agencies regarding the street naming change, and changing all official City maps.

The Board concurred in the recommendation of the Street Naming Committee that South Connecticut Street be renamed "South Royal Brougham Way" and forwards same to your Honorable Body for consideration and necessary legislative action. Attached is a sketch which identifies the area that is being renamed.

S. ROYAL BROUGHAM WAY-ST. RENAME ORD. NO

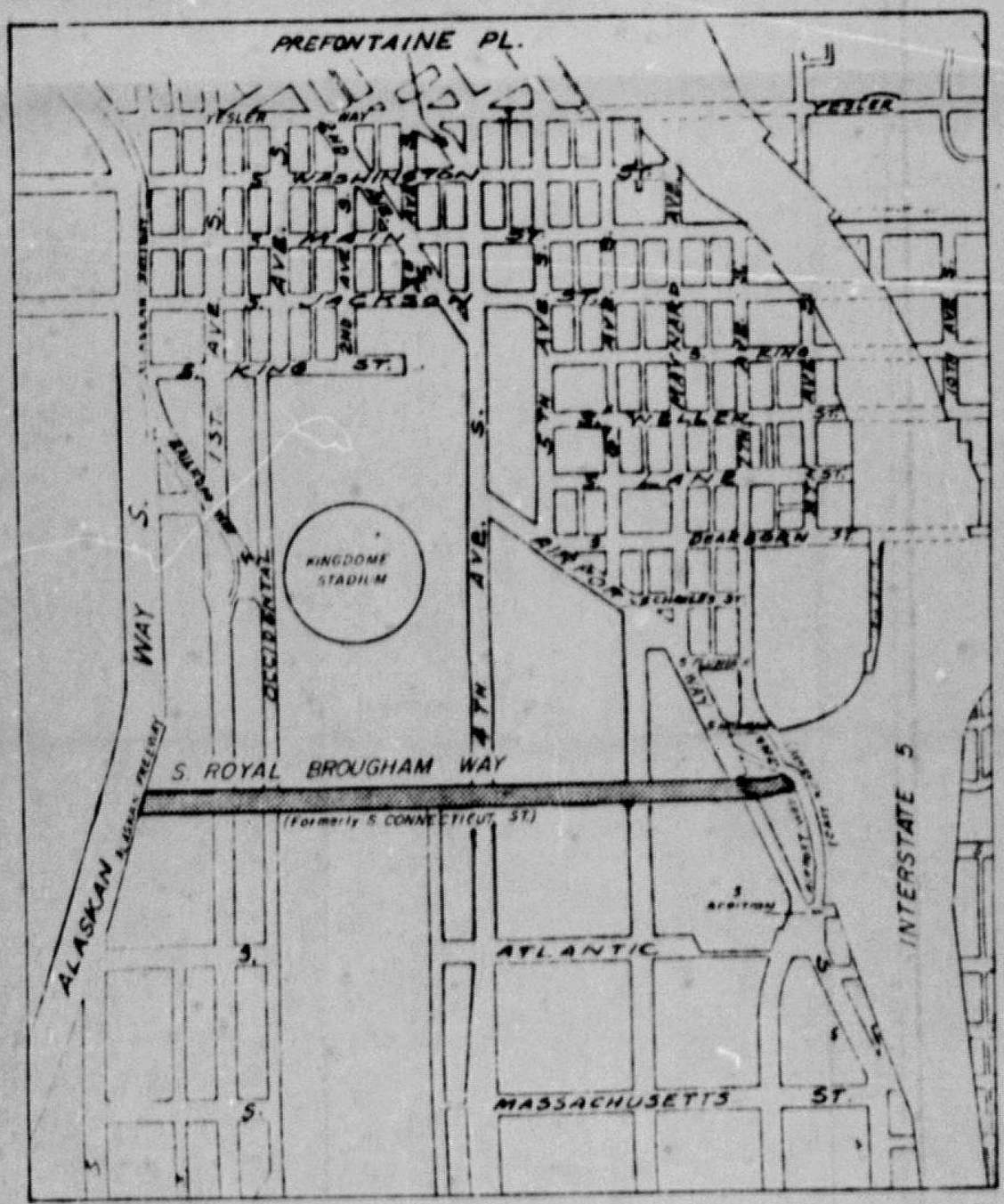
