WHEREAS, the Water Department has prepared the documents titled
Seattle Comprehensive Regional Water Plan Final Environmen-
tal Impact Statement, which incorporates by reference
COMPLAN and DEIS, in compliance with the procedural
requirements of the State and City; and

WHEREAS, the following water supply related ordinances and
resolutions previously approved by the Mayor and the
Seattle City Council are, by reference, made part of the
COMPLAN:

- Resolution 26178 regarding Seattle's role in the
implementation of Seattle Comprehensive Regional
Water Plan
- Ordinance 108515 regarding Cedar-Tolt Watershed
Management Plan
- Ordinance 107921 regarding Corrosion Control Plan
- Ordinance 105703 regarding Reservoir Protection
Plan

WHEREAS, the COMPLAN describes the programs and facilities
necessary to ensure an adequate and reliable supply of
drinking and industrial water for the Seattle service area
for the next 50 years; and

WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Water Advisory Committee (COMPWAC)
members have provided the Seattle Water Department with an
expression of their area's concerns and interests and
reviewed the progress of the Study at all stages; and

1 WHEREAS, the COMPWAC had made recommendations on water demands,
2 water conservation, treatment, source selection, water right
3 reservation, Seattle's role as regional supplier and Draft
4 Environmental Impact Statement, which (recommendations) have
5 generally been adopted by the Seattle Water Department and
6 incorporated into the COMPLAN; and

7 WHEREAS, the COMPLAN has been presented to the Seattle City
8 Council with the Mayor's recommendation that it be
9 approved; and

10 WHEREAS, the Council Water and Waste Management (W. & W.M.)
11 Committee, since April 1979 had held a number of briefing
12 and discussion sessions on various aspects of the COMPLAN
13 and also held a Public Hearing on the COMPLAN; and

14 WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the policies, regulations
15 and laws of the State of Washington and City of Seattle
16 have been interpreted and administered in accordance with
17 the policies set forth in R.C.W. 43.21C the State
18 Environmental Policy and the City of Seattle SEPA
19 Ordinance 105735; Now, Therefore,

20 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

21 Section 1. The City herewith adopts and the Superintendent
22 of Water is hereby authorized and directed to implement the
23 Seattle Comprehensive Regional Water Plan as described in the
24 Final Environmental Impact Statement (published September, 1979)
25 for the Seattle Comprehensive Regional Water Plan, with the
26 following modifications:

- 27 1) COMPLAN's recommendation on "System Expansion and
28 Purveyor Contracts" will be superceded by Resolution
26178 regarding a policy on Seattle's role as a
regional supplier of water
- 2) COMPLAN's recommendation on "next source of water
supply" will be replaced with the following language:
"Seattle supports the general principles of the
Snohomish River Basin Mediated Agreement and
recognizes that development of municipal and
industrial water supply on the Snoqualmie River
is essential to the implementation of the
Mediated Agreement as presently formulated.

1 However, the City plans to develop the North
2 Fork Tolt River as its next source of water
3 supply, and commence design work in 1983, unless
4 funding or other arrangements are made before
5 January 1983 that insure the cost to water con-
6 sumers of developing the Snoqualmie is commensurate
7 with benefits based on a "least-cost alternative"
8 approach. Seattle Water Department should partic-
9 ipate in studies related to the proposed Snohomish
10 Mediated Plan to the extent that Seattle's view-
11 point is represented in these studies."

12 3) COMPLAN's Recommendation on "Long-term Water
13 Conservation Program" is modified as follows:

- 14 ● Delete period and insert comma and add
15 "industrial and commercial users" at the
16 end of first sentence of paragraph 3, Page 3.35
17 of COMPLAN and DEIS (Published May 1979)
- 18 ● Include a project requesting County and
19 suburban cities to revise Plumbing Code requir-
20 ing lower volume plumbing fixtures in new
21 housing and rehabed bathrooms.
- 22 ● Include a rate structure (for Council consid-
23 eration) in the next rate increase proposal
24 which will penalize peak usage and encourage
25 conservation even if such a rate structure is
26 not recommended by the Department.
- 27 ● Include a clause in the proposed Purveyor
28 Contract that "Purveyors would participate
 in any Conservation Program developed and
 adopted by the City of Seattle."


4) COMPLAN's recommendation on "Water Service Policy" is amended as follows:

- Delete "could" in Line 3 of Section B, Exhibit 10 of COMPLAN and DEIS and insert "is planned to".


Section 2. The Superintendent of Water is hereby directed to revise the COMPLAN to include the modifications described in Section 1 above and send this plan to the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services in compliance with WAC 248-54 Public Water Supplies (RCW 43.20.050) and King County in compliance with their Ordinance Numbers 1709 and 2638.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.






Honorable Members:

WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Water Advisory Committee (COMPWAC) members have provided the Seattle Water Department with an expression of their area's concerns and interests and reviewed the progress of the Study at all stages; and

WHEREAS, the COMPWAC had made recommendations on water demands, water conservation, treatment, source selection, water right reservation, Seattle's role as regional supplier and Draft Environmental Impact Statement, which (recommendations) have generally been adopted by the Seattle Water Department and incorporated into the COMPLAN; and

WHEREAS, the COMPLAN has been presented to the Seattle City Council with the Mayor's recommendation that it be approved; and

WHEREAS, the Council Water and Waste Management (W & W. M.) Committee, since April 1979 had held a number of briefing and discussion sessions on various aspects of the COMPLAN and also held a Public Hearing on the COMPLAN; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the policies, regulations and laws of the State of Washington and City of Seattle have been interpreted and administered in accordance with the policies set forth in R. C. W. 43.213, the State Environmental Policy and the City of Seattle SEPA Ordinance 105735; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City herewith adopts and the Superintendent of Water is hereby authorized and directed to implement the Seattle Comprehensive Regional Water Plan as described in the Final Environmental Impact Statement (published September, 1979) for the Seattle Comprehensive Regional Water Plan, with the following modifications:

1) COMPLAN's recommendation on "System Expansion and Purveyor Contracts" will be superseded by Resolution 28178 regarding a policy on Seattle's role as a regional supplier of water.

2) COMPLAN's recommendation on "best source of water supply" will be replaced with the following language:

"Seattle supports the general principles of the Snohomish River Basin Mediated Agreement and recognizes that development of municipal and industrial water supply on the Snohomish River is essential to the implementation of the Mediated Agreement as presently formulated. However, the City plans to develop the Norfork Fork River as its next source of water supply, and commences design work in 1983, unless funding or other arrangements are made before January 1983 that insure the cost to water consumers of developing the Snohomish is commensurate with benefits based on a "least-cost alternative" approach. Seattle Water Department should participate in studies related to the proposed Snohomish Mediated Plan to the extent that Seattle's viewpoint is represented in these studies."

3) COMPLAN's Recommendation on "Long-Term Water Conservation Program" is modified as follows:

- Delete period and insert comma and add "Industrial and commercial users" at the end of first sentence of paragraph 3, Page 3-35 of COMPLAN and DEHS (Published May 1977)
- Include a project requiring County and suburban cities to revise Plumbing Code requiring lower volume plumbing fixtures in new housing and rehabbed bathrooms.
- Include a rate structure for Council consideration in the rate increase proposal which will penalize peak usage and encourage conservation even if such a rate structure is not recommended by the Department.
- Include a clause in the proposed Purveyor Contract that "Purveyors would participate in any Conservation Program developed and adopted by the City of Seattle."

4) COMPLAN's recommendation on "Water Service Policy" is amended as follows:

- Delete "could" in Line 3 of Section 5, Exhibit 10 of COMPLAN and DEHS and insert "is planned to."

Section 2. The Superintendent of Water is hereby directed to revise the COMPLAN to include the modifications described in Section 1 above and send this plan to the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services in compliance with WAC 248-54 Public Water Supplies (RCW 43.20.050) and King County in compliance with their Ordinance Number 1706 and 2636.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from date after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law, subject to the provisions of the City Charter.
