ORDINANCE 109489

AN ORDINANCE relating to the charging of fees for the use of P-patch garden plots and amending Section 1 of Ordinance 106958.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That as of January 1, 1980, Section 1 of Ordinance 106958 as last amended by Ordinance 107833 is further amended to read as follows:

Section 1. To partially offset the costs of the P-patch program, the Director of the Department of Human Resources is authorized by rules adopted in accordance with the Administrative Code of the City of Seattle (Ordinance 102228) to establish and collect fees for the use of P-patch garden plots. Fees shall be established in accordance with the size of garden plot used by the program participants and shall be no lower than the following:

10' X 20' plots (~~(\$15.00)~~) \$22.00 per year

10' X 40' plots (~~(\$20.00)~~) \$33.00 per year

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2.. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

ORDINANCE 10948

AN ORDINANCE relating to the charging of fees for the use of P-patch garden plots and amending Section 1 of Ordinance 10695E.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That as of January 1, 1980, Section 1 of Ordinance 10695E as last amended by Ordinance 107833 is further amended to read as follows:

Section 1. To partially offset the costs of the P-patch program, the Director of the Department of Human Resources is authorized by rules adopted in accordance with the Administrative Code of the City of Seattle (Ordinance 102228) to establish and collect fees for the use of P-patch garden plots. Fees shall be established in accordance with the size of garden plot used by the program participants and shall be no lower than the following:

- 10' X 20' plots (411-00) \$22.00 per year
- 10' X 30' plots (546-00) \$33.00 per year

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
