ORDINANCE 109772

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Parks and Recreation, transferring partial jurisdiction of certain City (Parks and Recreation Department) property in the southeast one-quarter of Section 20, Township 25 North, Range 4 East, W.M., to the Engineering Department for sanitary sewer purposes.

WHEREAS, the Director of Engineering and the Superintendent of the Department of Parks and Recreation have requested and the Mayor has recommended transfer of partial jurisdiction of certain City (Department of Parks and Recreation - Interlaken Park) property to the Engineering Department for sanitary sewer purposes; and

WHEREAS, relocation of an existing sanitary sewer into another alignment in the same parcel of City (Parks and Recreation Department) property will not interfere with the use of said parcel for park and recreation purposes and no additional burden capable of monetary measurement will be placed upon said parcel; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That such limited and partial jurisdiction of the following described real property:

A portion of the northeast one-quarter of the northeast one-quarter of the southeast one-quarter of Section 20, Township 25 North, Range 4 East, W.M., in King County, Washington, described as follows: Beginning at the northeast corner of said southeast one-quarter; thence north 89°07'55" west a distance of 540 feet; thence south 1°36'51" west a distance of 35 feet to a point which is the southwest corner of that parcel described by Ordinance 105024; thence south 89°07'55" east along the south line of said parcel 40.31 feet to the true point of beginning of this description; thence south 49°41'28" east a distance of 33.94 feet; thence north 70°46'54" east a distance of 62.78 feet; thence north 89°07'55" west a distance of 85.17 feet to the true point of beginning;

acquired for park and parkway purposes, pursuant to Ordinances 23336 and 79711 as is necessary to permit the relocation, construction, maintenance, operation and reconstruction of a

sanitary sewer line with appurtenances therein is hereby transferred to the Engineering Department on the condition that after construction the area will be restored as nearly as possible to the original condition at project expense.

Section 2 . This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

Transmitted for approval is a Council bill transferring partial jurisdiction over certain Park Department property, within East Interlaken Boulevard (Parkway) in the vicinity of East Lynn Street, to the Engineering Department in connection with the East Lynn Sanitary Sewer Project.
