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ORDINANCE **111187**

AN ORDINANCE vacating a portion of PROSPECT STREET on the petition of Western Marine Electronics Corporation, et al, C. F. No. 290866.

WHEREAS, there has been filed with the City Council the petition of Western Marine Electronics Corporation, et al, (Comptroller's File No. 290866) for the vacation of PROSPECT STREET described as follows:

PROSPECT STREET, from the east line of Aurora Avenue North as established by Ordinance 59719 and the west line of Dexter Avenue North as established by Ordinance 17628;

WHEREAS, following a public hearing on the petition commencing on May 26, 1982, the City Council considered the vacation of the above described street and determined, after being advised of the facts, that the vacation of the entire portion of said street was not in the public interest, but that the vacation of a portion of the area was in the public interest and that the vacation should be granted for the area described in the petition except that portion described as follows:

PROSPECT STREET lying between the east line of Aurora Avenue North as established by Ordinance 59719 and a line 30 feet east of and parallel therewith.

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C.W. 35.79.030 and Seattle Municipal Code 15.02, the petitioner has paid \$71,500 (SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND AND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS) to the City which amount is one-half of the appraised value of the property being vacated according to an appraisal obtained by the Director of Engineering; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That portion of Prospect Street described as follows:

PROSPECT STREET lying between the west line of Dexter Avenue North as established by Ordinance 17628 and a line 30 feet east of and parallel with the east line of Aurora Avenue North as established by Ordinance No. 59719.

be and the same is hereby vacated,

RESERVING to the City of Seattle the right to make all necessary slopes for cuts or fills upon the above described property in the reasonable original grading of any street abutting upon said property after said vacation.

Section ²..... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.




