AN ORDINANCE relating to Initiative Petitions; amending Section 2.08.010(B) of the Seattle Municipal Code to conform with Article IV, Section B of the Seattle City Charter requiring notification of rejection or approval of petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2.08.010(B) of the Seattle Municipal Code (Section 1 of Ordinance 103892, as last amended in 1979 by Section 1 of Ordinance 108216) is further amended as follows:

2.08.010(B)

Within (~~six~~) five business days after such filing, the City Comptroller shall approve or reject such petition as to form and notify the petitioner and, in the event of approval, shall also notify the petitioner by telephone and by certified mail of the exact language of the ballot title prepared pursuant to Section 2.08.020.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2..... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

AN ORDINANCE relating to Initiative Petitions; amending Section 2.08.010(8) of the Seattle Municipal Code to conform with Article IV, Section 3 of the Seattle City Charter requiring notification of rejection or approval of petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2.08.010(8) of the Seattle Municipal Code (Section 1 of Ordinance 103892, as last amended in 1979 by Section 1 of Ordinance 108216) is further amended as follows:

2.08.010(8)

Within ~~((six))~~ five business days after such filing, the City Comptroller shall approve or reject such petition as to form and notify the petitioner and, in the event of approval, shall also notify the petitioner by telephone and by certified mail of the exact language of the ballot title prepared pursuant to Section 2.08.020.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
