ORDINANCE 111620

AN ORDINANCE relating to Funeral Leave, amending SMC 4.28.020 to correct a typographical error.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code Section 4.28.020 (Section 3 of Ordinance 99753 as last amended by Ordinance 107905), is amended as follows:

4.28.020 Definitions.

For the purpose of this chapter "close relative" means the spouse, child, mother, father, brother, sister, grandchild, grandfather or grandmother of the officer or employee or of the spouse of such officer or employee. "Relative other than close relative" means the uncle, aunt, cousin, niece, or nephew of such officer or employee or the spouse of the brother, sister, child or grandchild of such officer or employee; or the uncle, aunt, cousin, niece, nephew, or spouse of the brother or sister of the spouse of such officer or employee.

Section 2. Any act consistent with the authority but prior to the effective date of this ordinance is ratified and confirmed.

Section 3... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.



SUBJECT: Proposed Amendment to Funeral Leave Ordinance to Correct
Typographical Error

Recently it was brought to our attention that a typographical error occurred in the preparation of Ordinance 107905, which error significantly changes the definition of "relative other than close relative".

When it became effective on January 1, 1972, Ordinance 100916 defined "relative other than close relative" as follows:

"... the uncle, aunt, cousin, niece, nephew or grandchild of such officer or employee, or the spouse of the brother, sister, child or grandchild of such officer or employee; or the uncle, aunt, cousin, niece, nephew, or the spouse of the brother or sister of the spouse of such officer or employee."

Ordinance 107905, adopted December 26, 1978, amended the definition:

"... the uncle, aunt, cousin, niece, or nephew (~~or grandchild~~) of such officer or employee or the spouse of the brother or sister of the spouse of such officer or employee."

Other than the obvious changes shown above, it appears that approximately two lines of text were unintentionally omitted from the definition by Ordinance 107905. The definition as we believe it was intended to be stated is shown below with the omitted portion underlined for clarity.

"The term relative other than close relative "shall mean the uncle, aunt, cousin, niece, or nephew of such officer or employee or the spouse of the brother, sister, child or grandchild of such officer or employee; or the uncle, aunt, cousin, niece, nephew, or spouse of the brother or sister of the spouse of such officer or employee."

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In the bill-draft form of Ordinance 107905 there is no deletion of the phrase as evidenced by double parenthesis and strike-outs. Because of this we believe deletion of the phrase was inadvertent. This resulted, however, in severely restricting the employee from attendance at the funeral of many of the employee's relatives and more severely restricts attendance at the funeral of relatives of the employee's spouse. We believe there is ample evidence in current departmental operating policies and bargaining unit agreements to show the City's intention to provide funeral leave benefits to employees more in keeping with the language of Ordinance 100916. The attached proposed legislation will retain the intended changes and correct the error enacted by Ordinance 107905. We respectfully request your favorable consideration of this proposed amendment.
