ORDINANCE 112044

AN ORDINANCE amending the Purchasing Agent's Ordinance (Seattle Municipal Code Section 3.14.806) to delete the requirement for the Purchasing Agent to keep a file of specifications of all consultant contracts.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code section 3.14.806 (Ordinance 102151 is amended as follows:

Section 3.14.806 COMPLIANCE BY CITY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES' - EXCEPTIONS

No city officer or employee shall have the authority to order or contract for the purchase of any supplies, materials, equipment, or service within the purview of this subchapter except through, or in accordance with rules and regulations prescribed by the City Purchasing Agent and no order or contract made contrary to the provisions of this subchapter shall be approved by the City Purchasing Agent or be binding upon the city; (~~providing that all using agencies contracting for expert and consultant services shall file with the Purchasing Agent Specifications as to the scope of work covered by any such contract for expert and consultant services; and provided further~~); provided, that contracts for services in connection with public works or which the Board of Public Works is or shall authorized to enter into, and all contracts for services in connection with the acquisition of real property and property rights, processing of claims and all litigation of the city or in which the city or any of its departments may be interested, shall be exempt from the requirements of this section.

1 Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in
2 force thirty days from and after its passage and approval,
3 if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at
4 the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the
5 city charter.



We are requesting, per this memo, the revision of Ordinance 102151, SMC section 3.14.806, which requires City departments to file specifications as to scope of work on all consultant contracts with the Purchasing Agent.

We propose that this section be deleted in order to reduce unnecessary paperwork for City departments as well as to recognize the fact that Purchasing does not have the staff to review these contracts. We feel that departments should review their own consultant contracts with the Comptroller performing his audit function to make sure that the contract was awarded properly.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code section 3.14.002 (Ordinance 102151 is amended as follows:

Section 3.14.002 COMPLIANCE BY CITY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES' - EXCEPTIONS

No city officer or employee shall have the authority to order or contract for the purchase of any supplies, materials, equipment, or service within the purview of this subchapter except through, or in accordance with rules and regulations prescribed by the City Purchasing Agent and no order or contract made contrary to the provisions of this subchapter shall be approved by the City Purchasing Agent or be binding upon the city; (providing that all using agencies contracting for expert and consultant services shall file with the Purchasing Agent Specifications as to the scope of work covered by any such contract for expert and consultant services and provided further); provided, that contracts for services in connection with public works or which the Board of Public Works is or shall authorized to enter into, and all contracts for services in connection with the acquisition of real property and property rights, processing of claims and all litigation of the city or in which the city or any of its departments may be interested, shall be exempt from the requirements of this section.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
