AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance 108539, and providing for the consolidation of the Emergency Medical Services Fund with the General Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Emergency Medical Services Fund, created by Ordinance 108539, is hereby closed and eliminated, effective December 31, 1985. All assets, liabilities, and residual fund balance remaining in the Emergency Medical Services Fund, unless otherwise specified by ordinance, shall be transferred to the General Fund, and the City Comptroller is hereby authorized and directed to make such transfers.

Section 2. Any act pursuant to the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
