BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1. There is added to Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 10.03 a new section, Section 10.03.100 as follows:

Section 10.03.100 FOOD AND BEVERAGE WORKER PERMIT FEES. The permit and administrative fees for food and beverage service workers subject to regulation by Section 10.11.212 are as follows:

- Examination fee \$1.50
- Permit fee (RCW Chapter 69.09, Chapter 248-86 WAC) \$2.00



Standard Operating Procedure 100-014
Request for Legislative Action

Section 1. AN ORDINANCE relating to food and beverage worker permit fees; adding a new section to Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 10.03 establishing fees.

Section 2. The objective of this proposal is to increase the food and beverage worker permit fees to a self-supporting level in 1987. The existing \$2.00 permit fee set by the state (RCW 69.09, WAC 248-86) has not been changed in over 15 years and covers only about 57% of direct and indirect service costs. Establishing an \$1.50 examination fee in addition to the permit fee would provide full reimbursement of service costs.

Section 3. The fee increase would offset an estimated \$70575 in local tax fund subsidies for food and beverage worker examination services in Seattle and King County.

Section 4. - 6. N.A.

Section 7. The establishment of a separate examination/administrative fee from the state-set permit fee has taken place in three other health departments in Washington.


