ORDINANCE 113308

AN ORDINANCE relating to social card games; amending Seattle Municipal Code Section 12A.50.010 and repealing Seattle Municipal Code Section 12A.22.080 to consolidate language.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 12A.22.080 of the Seattle Municipal Code is hereby repealed.

Section 2. Section 12A.50.010 of the Seattle Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

12A.50.010 Use of premises for social card games prohibited.

It is unlawful within the City for any person ((~~anyone~~)) to allow any premises or any facilities to be used for, to participate in or to conduct as a commercial stimulant or otherwise, any social card game as defined in RCW 9.46.020 ((~~Chapter 218, Laws of Washington, 1973 1st Ex. Sess. as amended by Chapter 155, Laws of Washington, 1974 1st Ex. Sess.~~)); provided, that this section shall not apply to social card games conducted or played by members on the premises of a licensed, bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization as authorized by RCW 9.146.030(9)(a); and provided, further, that this section shall not apply to social card games conducted or played in the dwelling or other place of residence of one of the players.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

Re: Proposed Housekeeping Ordinances

Honorable Councilmembers:

During recompilation of the Seattle Municipal Code, we asked City departments to review the Code for places of inaccurate, obsolete or conflicting language so that corrections could be made. As a result, transmitted herewith for your consideration are five proposed housekeeping ordinances.

Proposed Ordinance 1: Amending SMC 3.118.010A - Industrial Development Facilities.

SMC Chapter 3.118 was added by Ordinance 111395. During consideration of this ordinance, the City Council struck a section which provided for a fee to be charged for review of a public corporation's application. However, Section 3.118.010A.7 was not struck. This section requires an applicant to submit an application fee. The proposed housekeeping ordinance delete this section and all references to the application fee.

Proposed Ordinance 2: Amending SMC 3.104.010 - Fees for copies of public books and records.

This proposed ordinance amends Section 3.104.010 to allow the City record holder to charge for, and thus recover, the cost of postage for mailing copies of documents furnished for charge.

Proposed Ordinance 3: Amending and repealing various sections of SMC Title 4 relating to City employee salary and vacation provisions.

This proposed ordinance deletes all compensation provisions which are duplicative of provisions in collective bargaining agreements.

Proposed Ordinance 4: Amending SMC 10.13.040 - Definitions of the Meat, Rabbit, Poultry, and Aquatic Foods Code


This proposed ordinance deletes inaccurate references to other SMC sections.

Section 2. Section 12A.50.010 of the Seattle Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

12A.50.010 Use of premises for social card games prohibited.

It is unlawful within the City for any person (~~anyone~~) to allow any premises or any facilities to be used for, to participate in or to conduct as a commercial stimulant or otherwise, any social card game as defined in RCW 9.46.020 ((Chapter 212, Laws of Washington, 1973 1st Ex. Sess. as amended by Chapter 155, Laws of Washington, 1974 1st Ex. Sess.)); provided, that this section shall not apply to social card games conducted or played by members on the premises of a licensed, bona fide charitable or nonprofit organization as authorized by RCW 9.146.030(9)(a); and provided, further, that this section shall not apply to social card games conducted or played in the dwelling or other place of residence of one of the players.
