ORDINANCE 113355

AN ORDINANCE relating to and regulating plumbing; repealing existing Section 22.502.015 of the Seattle Municipal Code, and replacing it with a new Section 22.502.015 to adopt the 1985 Uniform Plumbing Code, various IAMPO Installation Standards and the Seattle Amendments thereto as the Plumbing Code of The City of Seattle.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 22.502.015 of the Seattle Municipal Code, as adopted by Ordinance 111995, is hereby repealed.

Section 2. A new Section 22.502.015 is added to the Seattle Municipal Code to read as follows:

22.502.015 Adoption of Uniform Plumbing Code,
IAMPO Installation Standards and Seattle Amendments.

Part I, Chapters 1 through 10, and Appendices A through D of the Uniform Plumbing Code, 1985 edition and IAMPO Installation Standards 3-75, 21-80, 2-82, 4-82, 6-82, 15-82, 17-82, 18-82, 5-83, 7-83 9-83, 12-83, 8-84, 10-84, 13-84, 20-84, 22-84, 23-84, all as published by the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials (one copy of which has been filed with the City Clerk in C.F. 295178), together with the Seattle Amendments to the 1985 Uniform Plumbing Code as adopted by Ordinance 113356 , shall constitute the Plumbing Code of The City of Seattle. In case of conflict between the Uniform Plumbing Code, the IAMPO Installation Standards and the Seattle Amendments, the Seattle Amendments shall be controlling.



The Seattle-King County Department of Public Health recommends the adoption of the enclosed ordinance which adopts the 1985 edition of the Uniform Plumbing Code with local amendments. The State Legislature has already adopted the 1985 edition, Chapter 19.27 RCW. This is an update of the present Seattle Plumbing Code which is based on the 1982 edition of the Uniform Plumbing Code.

The proposed legislation has been reviewed and approved by the Seattle-King County Plumbing Advisory Board.

The Water, Fire, Building, Parks, and Engineering Departments have also had the opportunity to review and comment on the proposal. None has voiced any objections to the proposed ordinance.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED PLUMBING CODE CHANGES

The majority of Code changes made in the 1985 edition of the Uniform Plumbing Code are merely editorial in nature and will have no effect in the inspection process in the City of Seattle. The changes that are not only editorial are minor in nature and are listed below.

Section 401 - Materials, subsection (a-3); disallows the use of vitrified clay pipe or fittings above ground or where pressurized by a pump or ejector.

Section 406 - Cleanouts, subsection (k); requires a hubless blind plug when used for a cleanout to be accessible for removal or replacement.

Section 803 - Use of Joints, new subsection (f); prohibits the use of female PVC screwed fittings for water piping (due to ease of thread damage).

Section 901 - Quality of Fixtures; requires water closet (toilet) seats be made of nonabsorbent material and be properly sized for the water closet bowl type.


Section 1001 - Running Water Required; requires that faucets and diverters be connected to the water distribution system so that hot water corresponds to the left side of the valve.

Section 1004 - Materials, subsection (a); allows the use of Chlorinated Poly (Vinyl Chloride) CPVC pipe and fittings for hot and cold water distribution within a building.

Section 1007 - Water Pressure, Pressure Regulators and Pressure Relief Valves, subsection (c); removes requirement for pressure relief valves on listed non-storage instantaneous heaters having an inside diameter of not more than three inches.

Section 1008 - Installation, Inspection and Testing, subsection (f); requires that unions be installed on water supply piping within twelve inches of equipment which may require service or removal.
