ORDINANCE 113374

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AN ORDINANCE amending Sections 21.40.050, 21.40.060, 21.40.080 and 21.76.040 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinances 90379 and 104472, as amended) as of June 1, 1987, to increase collection rates and charges of the Solid Waste Utility; modify the rate of credit for the elderly, handicapped or disabled; and establish fees for disposal by passenger cars at transfer stations.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As of June 1, 1987, Section 21.40.050 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinance 90379, Section 4, as last amended by Ordinance 112942, Section 3) is further amended as follows:

21.40.050 Garbage and rubbish collection rates

A. There is imposed upon all residences and other dwelling units within the City a charge for garbage and rubbish collection and disposal service in accordance with the following schedule: The rates listed below are effective (~~August 1, 1986~~) June 1, 1987.

1. All single-family residences: A charge per month or portion thereof, for each dwelling unit for once-a-week service, billed directly to the owner or tenant thereof as follows:

2. Multi-family variable-can rate schedule: A charge per month or portion thereof, for each dwelling unit for once-a-week service, billed directly to the owner or agent for the entire building thereof as follows:

6 3. The method by which the City shall calculate
7 the charge for each multi-family dwelling unit within
8 apartment houses and apartment hotels and for each resident
9 within boarding, rooming, fraternity, sorority and group
10 student houses for two (2) times a week service, billed
11 directly to the owner or agent for the entire building
12 shall be as follows, with the exception that the zero (0)
13 can rate remains the same: Multiply the one (1) can and
14 above multi-family rates imposed by subsection A2 by two
15 (2) and reduce this calculated amount by One Dollar and
16 Fifty Cents (\$1.50), to adjust for billing and collection
17 costs that occur only once a month.

18 4. All single-family and multi-family customers
19 requesting and receiving special, non-routine collection
20 service: A per-pickup charge of ~~((Ten-Dollars-(\$10.00)))~~
21 Eleven Dollars (\$11.00) for first can or ordinance unit
22 collected plus ~~((Three-Dollars-and-Thirty-Cents-(\$3.30)))~~
23 Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each additional unit and
24 ~~((Thirty-Dollars-(\$30.00)))~~ Thirty Three Dollars and
25 Seventy Cents (\$33.70) for each one (1) cubic yard col-
26 lected in a detachable container, ~~((Thirty-Eight-Dollars~~
27 ~~-\$38.00))~~ Forty Six Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$46.50) for
28 each one and one-half (1-1/2) cubic yards collected in a
detachable container and ~~((Forty-Dollars-(\$40.00)))~~ Fifty
Two Dollars and Twenty Five Cents (\$52.25) for each two (2)
cubic yards collected in a detachable container, billed

1 directly to the owner, tenant or agent for the entire
2 building. Each additional cubic yard over two (2) cubic
3 yards collected in a detachable container shall be
4 calculated as follows: $p_2 + n(p_1)$.

5 Where:

6 p_1 = price of one (1) cubic yard container collected
7 by special pickup.

8 p_2 = price of two (2) cubic yard container collected
9 by special pickup.

10 n = number of additional cubic yards.

11 B. The charges imposed by subsections A1, A2 and A3
12 shall not apply to dwelling units which elect to use
13 detachable containers supplied either by the City's
14 contractor or by the customer for the storage of garbage
15 and rubbish. Application for detachable container service
16 for a minimum period of six (6) months shall be made to the
17 Director of Engineering on forms supplied by him, and
18 collection of garbage and rubbish from such premises shall
19 be made at such frequency as is necessary as determined by
20 the Director of Engineering, but in no event less than once
21 each week. The monthly charges for detachable container
22 service for the container and frequency selected shall be
23 in accordance with the rates set forth in Section
24 21.40.060.

25 C. To be eligible for the zero can rate, a customer
26 may not generate any solid waste for collection or dis-
27 posal. With occupied premises, the customer must demon-
28 strate a consistent and effective practice of selective
purchasing to minimize refuse, of recycling material
whenever practical, and of composting any yard wastes
generated on the premises. A customer may not become

1 eligible for the zero can rate by hauling his or her
 2 garbage to a transfer station, disposal site, or by dis-
 3 posal in another customer's containers.

4 D. The Director of Engineering may adjust the service
 5 level to a customer to match the garbage actually collected
 6 from the premises, or, with multi-family occupancies, to
 7 match the amount of solid waste reasonably anticipated from
 8 the dwelling units on the premises.

9 Section 2. As of June 1, 1987, Section 21.40.060 of the
 10 amended by Ordinance 112942, Section 4) is further amended as
 11 follows:

21.40.060 Detachable Container Rates

12 Effective ((August-17-1986)) June 1, 1987 there is imposed
 13 upon detachable containers a charge for garbage and rubbish
 14 collection and disposal service in accordance with the following
 15 schedules:

$$\frac{((\$1.50 + en + f(\$10.39 + \$12.43n + \$12.60ns)))\$1.50 + cn + f(\$11.45 + \$13.36n + \$24.88ns)}{12}$$
, where:

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c = capital cost per container/60 months;
n = number of containers served;
f = number of pickups per week; and
s = size of container in cubic yards.

J. Mixed Use Building - The Director of Engineering will determine the appropriate residential collection service level for a mixed-use building according to the estimated amount of residential garbage or refuse generated and to be collected by the City.

Section 3. As of June 1, 1987, Section 21.40.080 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinance 90379, Section 5, as last amended by Ordinance 113163, Section 1) is further amended as follows:

21.40.080 Transfer station and disposal site rates.

A. The following rates are established for the use of the City's disposal sites and transfer stations effective ~~((August-17-1986))~~ June 1, 1987 except the rate revised by Seattle Municipal Code 21.40.080A.4 hereof, which shall be effective December 1, 1986, and except as otherwise provided in Seattle Municipal Code 21.40.080D:

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1. Be a credit customer of the Solid Waste Utility;
2. Be a non-profit charitable organization recognized as such by the Internal Revenue Service; and
3. Be engaged, as a primary form of its doing business, in processing abandoned goods for resale or reuse.

Section 4. As of June 1, 1987, Section 21.76.040 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinance 104472, Section 4, as last amended by Ordinance 112942, Section 6) is further amended as follows:

21.76.040 Rate of credit.

Persons qualified by the Department of Human Resources as eligible recipients of elderly/handicapped/disabled utility credits provided for in Section 21.76.010 shall be granted elderly/handicapped/disabled billing credits in the following stated monthly or monthly equivalent amounts; provided, however, that in no case shall the amount of the elderly/handicapped/disabled billing credit granted for a utility service exceed the amount owing for that service. The 1987 solid waste credits become effective June 1, 1987.

- Those residing in dwellings subject to duplex and multiple-family rates..... \$1.86

B. Water:

- Those residing in dwellings subject to single-family and duplex rates.. \$2.30

Section 5. Announcement of the rate increase and providing
other publicity and other actions preliminary to and to imple-
ment the increased rates as of June 1, 1987, and prior to the
effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirm-
ed.



Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

ORDINANCE _____

AN ORDINANCE amending Sections 21.40.050, 21.40.060, 21.40.080 and 21.76.040 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinances 90379 and 104472, as amended) as of June 1, 1987, to increase collection rates and charges of the Solid Waste Utility; modify the rate of credit for the elderly, handicapped or disabled; and establish fees for disposal by passenger cars at transfer stations.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As of June 1, 1987, Section 21.40.050 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinance 90379, Section 4, as last amended by Ordinance 112942, Section 3) is further amended as follows:

21.40.050 Garbage and rubbish collection rates

A. There is imposed upon all residences and other dwelling units within the City a charge for garbage and rubbish collection and disposal service in accordance with the following schedule: The rates listed below are effective (~~August 1, 1986~~) June 1, 1987.

1. All single-family residences: A charge per month or portion thereof, for each dwelling unit for once-a-week service, billed directly to the owner or tenant thereof as follows:

2. Multi-family variable-can rate schedule: A charge per month or portion thereof, for each dwelling unit for once-a-week service, billed directly to the owner or agent for the entire building thereof as follows:

3. The method by which the City shall calculate the charge for each multi-family dwelling unit within apartment houses and apartment hotels and for each resident within boarding, rooming, fraternity, sorority and group student houses for two (2) times a week service, billed directly to the owner or agent for the entire building shall be as follows, with the exception that the zero (0) can rate remains the same: Multiply the one (1) can and above multi-family rates imposed by subsection A2 by two (2) and reduce this calculated amount by One Dollar and Fifty Cents (\$1.50), to adjust for billing and collection costs that occur only once a month.

4. All single-family and multi-family customers requesting and receiving special, non-routine collection service: A per-pickup charge of ~~((Ten-Dollars-(\$10.00))~~ Eleven Dollars (\$11.00) for first can or ordinance unit collected plus ~~((Three-Dollars-and-Thirty-Cents-(\$3.30))~~ Five Dollars and Forty Cents (\$5.40) for each additional unit and ~~((Thirty-Dollars-(\$30.00))~~ Thirty Three Dollars and Ninety Cents (\$33.90) for each one (1) cubic yard collected in a detachable container, ~~((Thirty-Eight-Dollars-(\$38.00))~~ Forty Six Dollars and Forty Five Cents (\$46.45) for each one and one-half (1-1/2) cubic yards collected in a detachable container and ~~((Forty-Dollars-(\$40.00))~~ Fifty One Dollars and Eighty Five Cents (\$51.85) for each two (2) cubic yards collected in a detachable container, billed

1 directly to the owner, tenant or agent for the entire
2 building. Each additional cubic yard over two (2) cubic
3 yards collected in a detachable container shall be
4 calculated as follows: $p_2 + n(p_1)$.

5 Where:

6 p_1 = price of one (1) cubic yard container collected
7 by special pickup.

8 p_2 = price of two (2) cubic yard container collected
9 by special pickup.

10 n = number of additional cubic yards.

11 B. The charges imposed by subsections A1, A2 and A3
12 shall not apply to dwelling units which elect to use
13 detachable containers supplied either by the City's
14 contractor or by the customer for the storage of garbage
15 and rubbish. Application for detachable container service
16 for a minimum period of six (6) months shall be made to the
17 Director of Engineering on forms supplied by him, and
18 collection of garbage and rubbish from such premises shall
19 be made at such frequency as is necessary as determined by
20 the Director of Engineering, but in no event less than once
21 each week. The monthly charges for detachable container
22 service for the container and frequency selected shall be
23 in accordance with the rates set forth in Section
24 21.40.060.

25 C. To be eligible for the zero can rate, a customer
26 may not generate any solid waste for collection or dis-
27 posal. With occupied premises, the customer must demon-
28 strate a consistent and effective practice of selective
purchasing to minimize refuse, of recycling material
whenever practical, and of composting any yard wastes
generated on the premises. A customer may not become

1 eligible for the zero can rate by hauling his or her
 2 garbage to a transfer station, disposal site, or by dis-
 3 posal in another customer's containers.

4 D. The Director of Engineering may adjust the service
 5 level to a customer to match the garbage actually collected
 6 from the premises, or, with multi-family occupancies, to
 7 match the amount of solid waste reasonably anticipated from
 8 the dwelling units on the premises.

9 Section 2. As of June 1, 1987, Section 21.40.060 of the
 10 amended by Ordinance 112942, Section 4) is further amended as
 11 follows:

21.40.060 Detachable Container Rates

12 Effective ((August 1, 1986)) June 1, 1987 there is imposed
 13 upon detachable containers a charge for garbage and rubbish
 14 collection and disposal service in accordance with the following
 15 schedules:

10 ing, or his authorized agent, to issue and sell tickets at

15 his authorized agent.

16 C. State Tax Collection and Refund. The Director of
17 Engineering, or his authorized agent, has the authority to
18 collect State taxes due as required by State Law and to
19 make refunds to any person entitled thereto under State Law
20 and RCW 43.155.050.

21 D. Effective December 1, 1986, a charitable
22 organization qualified by the Director of Engineering or

3. Be engaged, as a primary form of its doing business, in processing abandoned goods for resale or reuse.

Section 4. As of June 1, 1987, Section 21.76.040 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinance 104472, Section 4, as last amended by Ordinance 112942, Section 6) is further amended as follows:

21.76.040 Rate of credit.

Persons qualified by the Department of Human Resources as eligible recipients of elderly/handicapped/disabled utility credits provided for in Section 21.76.010 shall be granted elderly/handicapped/disabled billing credits in the following stated monthly or monthly equivalent amounts; provided, however, that in no case shall the amount of the elderly/handicapped/disabled billing credit granted for a utility service exceed the amount owing for that service. The 1986 solid waste credits become effective August 1, 1986.





ORDINANCE 113356

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Plumbing Code of The City of Seattle; adopting the Seattle Amendments to the 1985 Uniform Plumbing Code.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the following sections of the 1985 Uniform Plumbing Code adopted by Ordinance 113355 are amended to read as follows. These amendments shall be known as the "Seattle Amendments to the 1985 Uniform Plumbing Code", and may be cited as such.

Section 10.4. Existing Installations. (a) Any plumbing system lawfully installed prior to the effective date of this Code may have its existing use continued and may be maintained or repaired if such use, maintenance or repair is in accordance with the original design and location and does not constitute a hazard to the public health, safety or welfare.

(b) The owner or his designated agent shall be responsible for the maintenance of any such existing plumbing system in a safe and sanitary condition.

Section 10.5. Authority to Abate. (a) Any portion of a plumbing system found by the Administrative Authority to be insanitary as defined in this Code is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

(b) Where a nuisance exists or a plumbing system is maintained in violation of this Code or any notice issued pursuant to this section, the Administrative Authority shall require such nuisance or violation to be abated and shall take such steps as may be necessary to abate the same in the manner provided by law.

(c) If at any time the Administrative Authority shall find that any plumbing system is not in compliance with this Code, or is otherwise unlawful, or dangerous or insanitary, or a menace to life, health or property, he is authorized to give notice of the corrections to the required owner or occupant of the premises wherein such system is located. Such notice may be given by personal service, or by mail, or by posting on the premises.

Section 20.1. Administrative Authority. The Director of Public Health or his authorized representative is hereby designated as the Administrative Authority who shall administer and enforce the provisions of this Code; provided, that the Superintendent of Water or his authorized representative shall be the Administrative Authority for the administration and enforcement of provisions relating to the inspection and approval of water meters and building supply piping; and provided further that the Director of Public Health and the Superintendent of Water shall exercise joint responsibility as Administrative Authority for administration and enforcement of provisions relating to installation and approval of backflow prevention devices installed in the building supply and water distributing piping in a building where cross connections exist or are likely to occur.

The Administrative Authority may adopt such rules and regulations consistent with this Code as shall be deemed necessary.

Section 20.6. Application for Permit. Applications for permits shall be made on forms provided by the Administrative Authority for such purpose and shall give a description of the work proposed to be done, the name of the contractor and permit applicant, and the location, ownership, and use of the premises upon which such work is to be done. The Administrative Authority may require to be furnished plans, specifications or drawings and may require such other information as he shall deem necessary for the administration and enforcement of this Code.

If the Administrative Authority determines that the plans, specifications, drawings, descriptions, and other information furnished by the applicant are in compliance with this Code and that the applicant is licensed to perform the work to be permitted, he shall issue the permit applied for upon payment of the prescribed fee.

b) Owner's Permit. Nothing contained in this Code shall prohibit any bona fide owner from installing plumbing or making alterations or repairs in his own residence or accessory building as permitted under the following terms and conditions:

(1) Such owner shall apply in person, secure a permit, and pay the required fee as set forth in the Schedule of Fees in this Code.

(2) Such owner shall do the work in the manner required by this Code, subject to inspection and approval by the Administrative Authority.

It is unlawful for any person having an owner's permit to allow another person, including a licensed plumber, to do any work under such owner's permit.

c) Existing Permits. Any work authorized by a permit in effect the effective date of this Code shall be performed pursuant to the laws and ordinances under which such permit was issued, and any conflicting requirement of this Code shall not apply to such work.

Section 20.8. Inspection of Work. (a) All plumbing and drainage systems shall be inspected by the Administrative Authority for compliance with the requirements of this Code.

(b) It shall be the duty of the person doing the work authorized by a permit to notify the Administrative Authority that the work is ready for inspection. Such notification may be given either orally or in writing and shall be given not less than twenty-four (24) hours before the work is to be inspected. Before such notification is given it shall be the duty of the person doing the work to make sure that work to be inspected will pass the test or tests prescribed in this Code.

(c) Fees for Reinspection Service. A reinspection fee of \$40.00 shall be assessed for each inspection or reinspection when such portion of work which inspection is called is not complete or when corrections called for are not made. This subsection is not to be interpreted as requiring inspection fees the first time a job is rejected for failure to comply with the requirements of this code, but as controlling the practice of calling for inspection before the job is ready for inspection or reinspection.

Reinspection fees may be assessed when the permit is not properly posted on the work site, the work to be inspected is not under test, or the permittee fails to provide access on the date for which inspection is requested, or for failure to make required corrections. To obtain a reinspection the applicant shall file an application therefore in writing upon a form furnished for that purpose, and pay the reinspection fee in accordance with this Section. In instances where reinspection fees have been assessed, an additional inspection of the work will be performed until the required fee has been paid.

Section 20.10. Whenever any work is being done contrary to the provisions of this Code, the Administrative Authority may order the work stopped by giving notice in writing to the person or persons doing or causing such work to be done, and any such person or persons shall forthwith stop such work until authorized by the Administrative Authority to proceed therewith.

Section 20.11. Suspension or Revocation of Permits.

(a) In addition to other penalties provided by law, any permit issued under this Code may be suspended or revoked where the same was issued in error or on the basis of incorrect information supplied by the applicant or for the violation of any of the provisions of this Code or other ordinances or any rules and regulations adopted by the Administrative Authority.

(b) Action to suspend or revoke any permit shall be commenced by mailing by certified mail to the permittee at the address shown on the permit records of the Administrative Authority, a written notice setting forth in specific terms the basis for such suspension or revocation.

(c) The permittee shall, within ten (10) days after the mailing of such notice, file with the Administrative Authority his written answer which shall admit or deny the allegations of such notice and may set forth such defenses and/or additional matter as said permittee shall deem appropriate. If the permittee desires a hearing in such action, he shall request the same in his answer.

(d) Upon failure of any such permittee to file an answer as herein provided, or in the event no hearing is requested, the Administrative Authority shall investigate and make findings and if cause exists therefor may suspend or revoke such permit.

(e) If a hearing is requested by the permittee, the Administrative Authority shall forward such request together with the notice of suspension or revocation and the permittee's answer thereto to the Hearing Examiner who shall give notice and conduct such hearing and thereafter recommend to the Administrative Authority a proposed decision in accordance with the Administrative Code of The City of Seattle (Ordinance 102228).

Section 20.12. Liability Claims. The Administrative Authority or any employee performing duties in connection with the enforcement of this Code and acting in good faith and without malice in the performance of such duties shall be relieved from any personal liability for any damage to persons or property as a result of any act or omission in the discharge of such duties.
