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AN ORDINANCE amending Subsection A of Section 21.76.040 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Section 4 of Ordinance 104472) as of January 1, 1988, to increase elderly/handicapped/disabled utility credit amounts for sewerage charges.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As of January 1, 1988, Subsection A of Section 21.76.040 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Section 4 of Ordinance 104472, as last amended by Ordinance 113165) is further amended as follows:

A. Sewer:

Those residing in dwellings
subject to single-family
rates ((~~\$3.85~~)) \$4.00

Those residing in dwellings
subject to duplex and multi-
family rates. ((~~\$2.25~~)) \$2.34

Section 2. Any act consistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

The attached Discussion Paper/Decision Agenda^{*} substantiates the work done to date by the Environmental Management Committee regarding proposed sewer rates for 1988.


The following recommendations were made by Councilmember Galle at the September 21 meeting of the Environmental Management Committee. Councilmembers Kraabel and Noland left the committee meeting before Sewer Rates were discussed.

1. Set the 1988 Sewer Utility net income at 1% of operating revenues.
Vote, 1-0
2. Set the 1988 Sewer Utility cash balance at 30 days of operating expenses
Vote, 1-0
3. Rate Design will continue current practice of customer charge reflecting cost-of-service.
Vote, 1-0
4. Low-income elderly/handicapped credits will be raised by one-half of recommended increases in the volume rate

A. Sewer:

Those residing in dwellings subject to duplex and multi-family rates -- ~~(\$2.25)~~ \$2.34

Section 2. Any act consistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
