ORDINANCE 113898

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Traffic Code, providing separate Code sections concerning the (1) operation and (2) parking of unlicensed vehicles on City streets and alleys or in any garage, parking area or other property operated by the City; Amending Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) Section 11.22.080; and adding a new section to SMC Chapter 11.72.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 11.22.080 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended as follows:

11.22.080 Vehicle license plates displayed.

No person shall operate ((~~stop~~, stand or park)) any vehicle on any street or alley without first having displayed current and proper vehicle license plates thereon as provided in RCW Chapter 46.16. The vehicle license plates shall be attached conspicuously at the front and rear of each vehicle for which the same are issued and in such manner that they can be plainly seen and read at all times: Provided, that if only one (1) license plate is legally issued for any vehicle such plate shall be conspicuously attached to the rear of such vehicle. Each vehicle license plate shall be placed or hung in a horizontal position at a distance of not less than one foot (1') nor more than four feet (4') from the ground and shall be kept clean so as to be plainly seen and read at all times: Provided, however, that this requirement shall not apply in cases where the State Commission

3 Section 2. Chapter 11.72 of the Seattle Municipal Code is

9 parking area or other property operated by the
10 City, without first having displayed current and
11 proper vehicle license plates thereon as provided
12 in RCW Chapter 46.16. The vehicle license plates
13 shall be attached conspicuously at the front and
14 rear of each vehicle for which the same are issued
15 and in such manner that they can be plainly seen
16 and read at all times: Provided, that if only one
17 (1) license plate is legally issued for any vehicle
18 such plate shall be conspicuously attached to the
19 rear of such vehicle. Each vehicle license plate
20 shall be placed or hung in a horizontal position
21 at a distance of not less than one foot (1') nor
22 more than four feet (4') from the ground and shall
23 be kept clean so as to be plainly seen and read at
24 all times: Provided, however, that this
25 requirement shall not apply in cases where the
26 State Commission on Equipment has granted
27 permission to deviate therefrom, as provided in RCW
28 46.16.240.







Section 1. Section 11.22.080 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended as follows:

11.22.080. Vehicle license plates displayed.

The vehicle license plates shall be attached conspicuously at the front and rear of each vehicle for which the same are issued and in such manner that they can be plainly seen and read at all times. Provided, that if only one (1) license plate is legally issued for any vehicle such plate shall be conspicuously attached to the rear of such vehicle.
