AN ORDINANCE relating to the license fee on amusement devices;  
amending Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) Section 5.32.170.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 5.32.170 of the Seattle Municipal Code  
(as last amended by Section 1 of Ordinance 112039) is amended as  
follows:

5.32.170 License Fees.

A. The license fee for any amusement device which is  
operated or activated by the insertion of a coin or currency  
shall be based upon the minimum price levied for play or use  
of the device. The fee shall be:

1. For riding devices, for each Five Cents (\$.05) of  
the price, the license fee shall be Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00)  
per year;

2. For nonelectronic games such as pool, billiard,  
shuffleboard, and Foosball tables, for each Five Cents  
(\$.05) of the price, the license fee shall be Fifteen  
Dollars (\$15.00) per year;

3. For electronic games, commonly known as "video  
games," for each Five Cents (\$.05) of the price, the license  
fee shall be Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per year;

4. For all other coin or currency operated amusement  
devices, for each Five Cents (\$.05) of the price the license  
fee shall be Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per year.

The maximum license fee shall be Seventy-five dollars  
(\$75.00) per device per year.

B. The license fee for any amusement device which is not  
operated or activated by the insertion of a coin or  
currency, shall be Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per year.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 5.32.170 of the Seattle Municipal Code  
(as last amended by Section 1 of Ordinance 112039) is amended as  
follows:

5.32.170 License Fees.

A. The license fee for any amusement device which is  
operated or activated by the insertion of a coin or currency  
shall be based upon the minimum price levied for play or use  
of the device. The fee shall be:

1. For riding devices, for each Five Cents (\$.05) of  
the price, the license fee shall be Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00)  
per year;
2. For nonelectronic games such as pool, billiard,  
shuffleboard, and Foosball tables, for each Five Cents  
(\$.05) of the price, the license fee shall be Fifteen  
Dollars (\$15.00) per year;
3. For electronic games, commonly known as "video  
games," for each Five Cents (\$.05) of the price, the license  
fee shall be Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per year;
4. For all other coin or currency operated amusement  
devices, for each Five Cents (\$.05) of the price the license  
fee shall be Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per year.

The maximum license fee shall be Seventy-five dollars  
(\$75.00) per device per year.

B. The license fee for any amusement device which is not  
operated or activated by the insertion of a coin or  
currency, shall be Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per year.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and  
after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect  
at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
