AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Human Resources, establishing an "Abused Women's Shelter Fund" account in the "General Donations and Gift Trust Fund," accepting donations, making appropriations and authorizing expenditures.


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As requested by the Director of the Department of Human Resources and recommended by the Mayor in the materials attached hereto, there is hereby established an "Abused Women's Shelter Fund" account in the "General Donations and Gift Trust Fund" into which shall be deposited donations intended for the support of the New Beginnings Shelter for Battered Women and the Salvation Army's Catherine Booth House. All necessary appropriations of donated funds for the intended purpose are hereby made and authorized. Funds in such account shall be split equally between the two programs. The Director of Human Resources is authorized to draw and the City Treasurer to pay warrants against such account on vouchers approved by the Director.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.







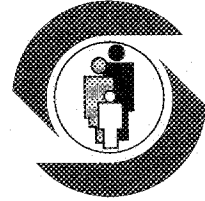

SUBJECT: Request for Legislation to Establish Subaccount in the General  
Donation and Gifts Trust Fund to Receive Contributions for  
Abused Women's Shelters

Earlier this year, representatives of an otherwise unaffiliated group of churches contacted the City to express interest in soliciting contributions from their congregations to assist the City in the provision of services to the homeless. Department staff representing our Homeless Donation Service met with representatives of the churches and provided information on the various City-funded human service programs. The group has recently selected two programs serving abused women and their children to be the recipients of these funds: New Beginnings Shelter for Battered Women and the Salvation Army's Catherine Booth House.

The City purchases services from both Catherine Booth House and New Beginnings through Human Service Program allocations. The annual budgets of both programs require substantial amounts from private fund raising efforts. The contributions from these churches, expected to total in the neighborhood of \$10,000, will provide a portion of the private sector funds needed by both programs.

The attached legislation would establish a subaccount entitled the "Abused Women's Shelter Fund" within the "General Donations and Gift Trust Fund," and authorizes the Director of Human Resources to disperse the funds received by this subaccount equally between the two programs.

A ceremony for the presentation of these contributions to the City is scheduled for May 6. Representatives of the City and of the two programs will be on hand.

The generous donations of this group and the presentation of the funds to the City as custodian recognizes the needs of these programs and the role of the City in supporting such services. This action also marks another success of our Homeless Donation Service which has channeled some \$103,273 in goods, services and donations directly to programs serving the homeless since the service began operating in March, 1988.
