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ORDINANCE 114567

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AN ORDINANCE relating to the Engineering Department; authorizing the hiring of consultants in connection with the Westlake Park Paver Repair Project; authorizing the awarding of contracts; increasing an expenditure allowance in the 1989 Budget of the Engineering Department by reimbursable appropriation from the Engineering Operating Fund and making a conditionally reimbursable appropriation from the Westlake Fund.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As requested by the Director of Engineering and recommended by the Mayor in the attachments hereto, the Director of Engineering is authorized to hire expert and consulting services to oversee the design and construction related to the repair of the Westlake Park pavers.

Section 2. The Director of Engineering is authorized, under the direction of the Board of Public Works, to proceed with the construction of the repair of the Westlake Park pavers as described in Section 1 hereof, by the awarding of a contract or contracts therefor, or in the discretion of the Board, by the use of day labor subject to State law.

Section 3. For the activities authorized in Section 1 herein, the expenditure allowance below in the 1989 Budget of the Seattle Engineering Department is increased as follows:

<u>Program Category</u>	<u>Object of Expenditure</u>	<u>Amount</u>
3700	53000 - Other Services and Charges	\$650,000

and said sum or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Engineering Department Operating Fund. The Engineering Operating Fund shall be reimbursed by the appropriation and transfer hereby made and authorized of a like amount from the Westlake Fund. The Westlake Fund shall be reimbursed to the greatest extent possible from funds received

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as a result of legal actions and/or settlements pertaining to the Westlake Park Project. The City Comptroller is authorized to draw and the City Treasurer to pay the necessary warrants and make the necessary transfers.

Section 4. Any act consistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

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(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 5... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

Subject: Westlake Park Paver Repair

Dear Mayor Royer:

REQUEST. We request City Council adoption of the attached ordinance. This ordinance authorizes the Director of Engineering to proceed with work to repair the Westlake Park Pavers on Pine Street. The ordinance also appropriates funds from the Engineering Operating Fund and makes a reimbursable appropriation from the Westlake Fund.

BACKGROUND. The pavers in Pine Street began failing some time after Pine Street was fully opened to traffic in November, 1988. Since that time, the City has retained the services of two independent experts in the design and repair of paver systems. Each consultant was asked to independently evaluate the causes of the failure in Pine Street and to propose a solution that will allow us to maintain the paving patterns in the street.

Both of the consultants, Dr. Raymond Rollings from the Army Corp of Engineers and Dr. John Knapton from England, indicated the primary cause of the failure was the type of bedding sand used under the granite pavers. The filter fabric may also have played a part in the failure by inhibiting the compaction of the sand when the pavers were originally placed.

Repair of the pavers will begin this summer and is expected to take two months. The pavers will be removed; the existing sand will be replaced. Then the pavers will be relaid and an epoxy sealer will be poured between the joints to prevent water from entering the sand. Pine Street between the intersections of 4th and 5th Avenues will remain closed until well into the fall, while we evaluate the performance of the pavers in the intersections.



FUNDING. Total cost for the repair of the pavers is \$650,000. The attached ordinance appropriates \$650,000 from the Westlake Fund to pay the costs. It is anticipated that the Westlake Fund will be reimbursed from funds arising out of negotiations or legal actions the City will take involving the designer of the project.

IMPORTANCE. Engineering would like to begin work on repairing the pavers in June in order to take advantage of the driest weather conditions. Resolution 27967, passed by the City Council on May 5, 1989, requested immediate action on the repair of the street pavers.
