ORDINANCE 114736

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Traffic Code; amending the Seattle Municipal Code, Section 11.23.030 (Ordinance 114251, Section 7) to authorize the issuance of transferable commercial load zone permits.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code, Section 11.23.030 (Ordinance 114251, Section 7 (part)) is amended as follows:

11.23.030 Commercial loading ((zone)) permit -- Requirements.

A. The Traffic Engineer is hereby authorized to administer a system for the issuance of commercial loading ((zone)) permits and to collect fees therefor. Commercial loading ((zone)) permits shall only be issued to persons or entities that possess a current business license issued by any governmental jurisdiction. The applicant may obtain one (1) nontransferable permit for each ((commercial)) truck licensed vehicle ((registered to and/or)) operated by the company named in the business license except as provided in Subsection "B" of Section 11.23.030. The permit shall be permanently affixed to the lower left hand corner of the vehicle's windshield except as provided in Subsection B of Section 11.23.030. The applicant shall provide the license plate number, as well as other vehicle identification information as determined by the Traffic Engineer

B. Companies that operate a fleet of ten (10) or more commercial vehicles will be eligible to purchase one (1) transferable permit for every five (5) commercial vehicles in their fleet with nontransferable permits. The transferable


10 Section 2. Any act pursuant to the authority and prior to  
11 the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and  
12 confirmed.

Section...2... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.



Dear Mayor Royer:

REQUEST. We request City Council adoption of the attached ordinance which amends the City's Traffic Code. The amendment is to Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 11.23.030.

BACKGROUND. The City's Traffic Code presently requires a commercial load zone permit to be purchased for each truck that uses those zones. The applicant is required to provide the license plate number as well as other vehicle identification information to get the nontransferable permit.

We are amending the Traffic Code to allow for transferable permits for companies that operate large fleets of trucks. The transferable permits are only to be used on other commercial vehicles in the company fleet while a commercial vehicle with a nontransferable permit is temporarily out of service.
