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ORDINANCE 114813

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Animal Fee Ordinance; amending Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) Sections 9.26.020 and 9.26.050.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 9.26.020 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended as follows:

Section 9.26.020 Cat or dog license fee -- Renewal.

The fee for each ((new)) cat or dog license and for each annual period of renewal shall be:

A. Cats

Altered \$((5.00)) 7.00
Unaltered \$((12.00)) 14.00

B. Dogs

Altered \$((8.00)) 10.00
Unaltered \$((20.00)) 22.00

C. Late fee for renewal of a cat or dog license more than thirty (30) days after expiration . . . \$10.00

D. Guide or Service dog for the handicapped No fee

E. Dog or cat owned by a member of the diplomatic or consular corps of a country having a treaty with the United States granting immunity from local law, upon submission of proof of such status No fee

F. Dog or cat ((of owner of a)) owned by a person possessing a valid "senior citizen's identification card" or "handicapped person's identification card" issued by The City of Seattle Human Resources Department
Fifty percent (50%) of license fee otherwise payable

G. Lost cat or dog ((identification)) license tag, upon submission of affidavit attesting to loss . \$ 2.00

Section 2. Section 9.26.050 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended as follows:

Section 9.26.050 Other animal control fees and charges.

Other animal control fees shall be:

A. Administrative fee for each detained animal. \$20.00

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B. For each twenty-four (24) hour period or part thereof for kenneling 5.00

C. For each animal adopted 5.00

~~((D. For each trapping permit 5.00))~~

~~((E.))~~ D. For each dangerous animal 25.00

~~((F.))~~ E. For collecting and disposing of an owner's animal, whether the animal is dead or alive . 5.00

~~((G.))~~ F. For the handling of animals, other than dogs and cats, charges may be assessed to recover the cost of special equipment.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

Dear Honorable Councilmembers:

The Department of Licenses and Consumer Affairs is submitting a proposal to increase the pet license fees for 1990. The fees will be increased as follows:

Dog: Unaltered \$20.00 to \$22.00
Altered \$ 8.00 to \$10.00

Cat: Unaltered \$12.00 to \$14.00
Altered \$ 5.00 to \$ 7.00

The purpose of this increase is to reduce the Division of Animal Control's subsidy from the General Fund and to generate revenue for the City. Animal Control generated \$456,688 in revenue in 1988. Of this amount, \$372,369 was generated from pet license fees. Providing services during 1988 cost \$1,293,372 of which \$836,704 was subsidized from the General Fund. The increase in pet license fees from 1990 will produce \$102,832 in additional revenue.

The pet license fees were last increased in 1988. The Department of Licenses and Consumer Affairs is requesting a pet license fee increase again in 1990 to offset the continuing increase in costs, and to reduce the subsidy from the General Fund. This increase will make the Seattle Animal control pet license fees comparable to those of King County.

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Animal Fee Ordinance; amending Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) Sections 9.26.020 and 9.26.050.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 9.26.020 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended as follows:

Section 9.26.020 Cat or dog license fee -- Renewal.

The fee for each ~~((new))~~ cat or dog license and for each annual period of renewal shall be:

- A. Cats
 - Altered \$((15.00)) 7.00
 - Unaltered \$((12.00)) 14.00
- B. Dogs
 - Altered \$((8.00)) 10.00
 - Unaltered \$((20.00)) 22.00
- C. Late fee for renewal of a cat or dog license more than thirty (30) days after expiration . . . \$10.00
- D. Guide or service dog for the handicapped No fee
- E. Dog or cat owned by a member of the diplomatic or consular corps of a country having a treaty with the United States granting immunity from local law, upon submission of proof of such status No fee
- F. Dog or cat ~~((of owner of a))~~ owned by a person possessing a valid "senior citizen's identification card" or "handicapped person's identification card" issued by The City of Seattle Human Resources Department Fifty percent (50%) of license fee otherwise payable
- G. Lost cat or dog ~~((identification))~~ license tag, upon submission of affidavit attesting to loss . . . \$ 2.00
