7 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

8 Section 1. Section 6.202.460 of the Seattle Municipal
9 Code is amended as follows:

10 6.202.460 Liability Insurance.

11 A. In those instances where the new license code
12 requires that the applicant for the license shall
13 provide insurance as a condition of receiving a
14 license the purpose of the requirement is to insure
15 that members of the public and the City will be
16 compensated for losses caused by personal injury or
17 property damage resulting from the tortious acts of
18 the licensee or its agents or employees.

19 B. Whenever the issuance of a license is
20 conditioned upon an applicant's obtaining liability
21 insurance, each insurance policy:

22 1. Shall be issued by a company authorized
23 to do business as an insurer in the state pursuant
24 to the provisions of RCW Title 48 as now or
25 hereafter amended; and

26 2. Shall contain the following recital:

27 (~~"This policy is issued pursuant to Section 1.060
28 of the Revised License Code (Ordinance No. 108934,
as amended, of the City of Seattle, for the purpose
of complying with the conditions and requirements
of the Code. Any exception, limitation, provision,
or omission in this policy (including all other~~

1 ~~endorsements thereto) in conflict with any such~~
2 ~~condition or requirement is void. This policy shall~~
3 ~~be continuous until cancelled and terminable only~~
4 ~~upon at least ten (10) days' prior written notice~~
5 ~~to the Director of Licenses and Consumer Affairs.))~~
6 "Should any of the above described policies be
7 cancelled before the expiration date thereof, the
8 issuing company will mail 20 days prior written
9 notice to the Director of Licenses and Consumer
10 Affairs. The policies shall remain in effect during
11 this 20-day cancellation period."

12 3. Shall name The City of Seattle as an
13 additional insured.

14 ((3+))4. May be approved as to sufficiency and
15 form by the City Attorney at the request of the
16 Director; and

17 ((4+))5. Shall be furnished to the Director
18 for filing with the City Comptroller.

19 Section 2. Any act consistent with the authority and
20 prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby
21 ratified and confirmed.
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(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.



Dear Councilman Smith:

Please find attached, an ordinance which amends the liability insurance language of the General Provisions of the New License Code. The current insurance language is no longer being used by any insurance companies. We have attached correspondence from the insurance company stating that policies are no longer being written as currently required by ordinance.

In coordination with Seattle's Claims Manager, we have amended the section (SMC 6.202.460 Liability Insurance) to utilize standard insurance terminology, increasing the notice times from ten days to twenty days insuring that taxicabs are properly insured, and to have Seattle named as an additional insured on each policy.

This amendment has no fiscal impact, but will update the code to meet standardized insurance industry language and simplify the insurance requirements for licensees, without any loss of insurance coverage. I therefore, recommend consideration and passage of this amendment by the Council.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 6.202.460 of the Seattle Municipal Code is amended as follows:

6.202.460 Liability Insurance.

A. In those instances where the new license code requires that the applicant for the license shall provide insurance as a condition of receiving a license the purpose of the requirement is to insure that members of the public and the City will be compensated for losses caused by personal injury or property damage resulting from the tortious acts of the licensee or its agents or employees.

B. Whenever the issuance of a license is foreign banking corporation, Korea Exchange Bank, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Washington for King County.
