ORDINANCE 115439

AN ORDINANCE relating to health code fees; amending SMC 10.03.013.A to increase annual permit fees for certain retail meat, rabbit, poultry, and aquatic food shops and to establish new extra unit fees.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Effective January 1, 1991, Seattle Municipal Code 10.01.013.A (part of Section 1 of Ordinance 110881, as last amended by Section 8 of Ordinance 115139) is amended as follows:

A. Amount of Permit Fees. The fees for annual permits issued pursuant to Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 10.13 shall be as follows:

1. Permit for wholesale MPRAF shop in which one or more persons are engaged in preparing and processing and/or dispensing MPRAF food products:

a. Two or fewer persons so engaged ..... \$500.00

b. Three or more persons so engaged ..... \$700.00

2. Wholesale MPRAF dealer's permit ..... \$400.00

3. Retail processed MPRAF shop permit ..... \$ 75.00

4. Permit for retail MPRAF shop in which one or more persons are engaged in preparing, processing, or dispensing MPRAF or MPRAF products:

~~((a. One person so engaged ..... \$200.00))~~

a.((b. Two or)) Up to three persons so engaged ..... \$250.00

b.((c.)) Four or more persons so engaged ... ~~(((\$300.00))~~ \$350.00

5. MPRAF warehouse permit ..... \$ 75.00

6. Extra unit fee: smoke shop, deli, seafood, gourmet  
each ..... \$125.00

7.((6.)) Meat cutter's permit, and apprentice meat cutter's permit ..... \$ 15.00

8.((7.)) Meat cutter's examination ..... \$ 15.00

Provided, that the fee for any annual permit issued during the period beginning January 1 and ending June 30 of any year, shall be an amount equal to one-half (½) of the applicable fee stated above.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise



Please find attached SOP 100-014 Request for Legislative Action and proposed ordinance to revise MPRAF permit fees contained in Section 10.03.013.A of the Seattle Municipal Code. This request is part of and consistent with the Health Department's 1991 Budget Request.

Fee increases are intended to maintain the inspection program on a self-supporting basis. The proposal would increase the fee of a one-person MPRAF shop from \$200.00 to \$250.00 and increase the fee for a four-or-more person MPRAF shop from \$300.00 to \$350.00. In addition any MPRAF shop operating a separate smoke shop, deli, seafood bar, or gourmet bar would be charged an annual extra unit fee of \$125.00 each. Annual permit fee increases would affect 232 shops in Seattle and King County and extra unit fees would be charged to an estimated 284 extra units. Total revenues would be increased by an estimated \$47,100 through these fee changes.

The permit fees were last changed in 1982. A proposal for the same fee changes in King County is being submitted to the King County Board of Health for adoption.

SOP 100-014 Request for Legislative Action

An ordinance relating to health code fees; amending SMC 10.03.013.A to increase annual permit fees for certain retail meat, poultry, rabbit and fish shops and to establish new extra unit fees.

1. The objective of this proposal is to increase revenues in order to operate the inspection program on a self-supporting basis.

2. Fee increases and changes are as follows:

3. Revenues are deposited in the Public Health Pooling Fund.

4. The program supported by the revenue is regulatory, SMC 10.13 - Meat Code.

5. No new positions are associated with this request.

6. No new facilities or equipment are associated with this request.

7. Programs are evaluated under the Environmental Health Services data system and the King County fiscal monitoring system (ARMS).

8. This request offsets \$47,100 in what would otherwise be required in local tax support.
