

ORDINANCE 115521

1 AN ORDINANCE establishing a Chinese Garden Memorial Account in the  
2 General Donations and Gift Trust Fund, declaring its purposes,  
3 and authorizing acceptance of donations thereto.

4 WHEREAS, Clarence M. "Bud" Girtch, Deputy Superintendent of the Seattle  
5 Department of Parks and Recreation, passed away on October 17,  
6 1989; and

7 WHEREAS, Mr. Girtch was widely known in the field of parks and  
8 recreation being a member of a number of professional  
9 organizations including the Washington Recreation and Parks  
10 Association and the National Recreation and Parks Association;  
11 elected to the American Academy of Parks and Recreation in 1987  
12 and listed in Who's Who in the West from 1984 through 1989;  
13 and

14 WHEREAS, during his tenure with the Seattle Department of Parks and  
15 Recreation Mr. Girtch established an impressive array of  
16 innovative project concepts; and

17 WHEREAS, one such project included the conceptual framework for a  
18 Classical Chinese Garden in Seattle wherein Mr. Girtch worked  
19 directly with various community groups and public and private  
20 agencies and the City of Chongqing, People's Republic of China;  
21 and

22 WHEREAS, the Girtch Family asks that remembrances be sent to the  
23 Seattle Chinese Garden Foundation in care of the Superintendent  
24 of Parks and Recreation for deposit in a memorial account for  
25 use in developing a Classical Chinese Garden in Seattle; NOW,  
26 Therefore,

27 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

28 Section 1. There is hereby established in the General Donations  
and Gift Trust Fund an account, entitled the Chinese Garden Memorial  
Account. The Superintendent of Parks and Recreation is authorized  
to accept for and on behalf of The City of Seattle gifts in memory  
of Clarence M. "Bud" Girtch and other donations for the account or  
account purposes and to deposit them in the account. Expenditures  
from the account shall be on authorizations approved by the  
Superintendent of Parks and Recreation. The Superintendent shall  
consult with the Girtch family regarding appropriate objects of  
expenditure before expenditures are authorized from donations.

Section 2. Monies in the Chinese Garden Memorial Account may  
be temporarily deposited in such institutions or invested in such  
obligations as may be lawful for the investment of City money.  
Proceeds received and any interest and profit received from the deposit  
or investment of such funds shall be deposited in said Account and  
applied and used solely for account purposes as contemplated in Section  
1 hereof.

Section 3. Upon the fourth anniversary of the adoption of this  
ordinance and every four (4) years thereafter as may be necessary,

1 the family and the estate of Clarence M. "Bud" Girtch shall review  
2 the total contributions herein with the Superintendent to determine  
3 the continued status of the Memorial Fund.

4 **Section 4.** Acceptance of donations pursuant to the authority  
5 and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified  
6 and confirmed.

## LEGISLATIVE REQUEST SUPPORTING INFORMATION

In conformance with The City of Seattle's Operating Procedure 200-001 the following information is submitted.

### TITLE OF PROJECT

An ordinance establishing a Chinese Garden Memorial Account in the General Donations and Gift Trust Fund, declaring its purposes, and authorizing acceptance of donations thereto.

### STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVES

This ordinance will authorize The Department to accept donations in memory of Clarence M. (Bud) Girtch, former Deputy Superintendent for Operations of the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation.

### CURRENT STATUS

All donations have, to date, been deposited into the Treasurer's Clearing Fund.

### HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

Mr. Girtch was actively involved with the development of a Chinese Garden concept for Seattle.

- He worked with officials of our sister city in Chongqing to develop the original master plan for the Chinese Garden.
- His work led to the identification of the South Seattle Community College Arboretum as the preferred site for the development of a Chinese Garden.
- He worked with the Chinese Garden Foundation and other public and private agencies to begin to bring the Classical Chinese Garden concepts to a more detailed planning stage.

Mr. Girtch passed away on October 17, 1989. Because of his long standing affiliation with the Parks Department and the field of recreation, his family requested that contributions be sent to a Chinese Garden Memorial Fund via the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation.

### PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS

No additional department staff are required to account for these funds.

### FACILITY AND EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

The actual type of Classical Chinese Garden and related equipment is unknown at this time. Both of these aspects of the project are still in the planning stage.


