BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As requested by the Municipal Court and recommended by the Mayor in the material attached hereto, Seattle Municipal Code 4.13.010 E is amended as follows:

Dear Councilmember Sibonga,

I am forwarding to you a proposed ordinance which amends the Seattle Municipal Code 4.13.010-E to provide exempt status to the newly created positions of Municipal Court Marshal and Municipal Court Marshal, Supervisor. These positions are similar to both bailiff and warrant officer positions, both of which are exempt categories, in that the marshals will have a fiduciary relationship to the Municipal Court judges. The marshals shall have the authority and the responsibility to make arrests, transport prisoners on behalf of the court, and maintain order in the courtrooms and other areas of court operations. I believe all parties concerned with creating these positions, the Court, OMB, and Council staff, intended the positions would be exempt.

The City's Personnel Department has reviewed this proposed ordinance and concurs that the Municipal Court Marshal and Municipal Court Marshal, Supervisor positions are appropriate for exemption.

The Court intends to fill the marshal positions as quickly as possible. Candidates will be informed the positions are being considered for exemption and candidates selected will be required to acknowledge that these positions may become exempt during their term of employment.


