WHEREAS, the Seattle Comprehensive Transportation Program (SCTP), which was adopted by Resolution 26904 and revised by Resolution 27152, contains guidelines and designations for arterial classifications; and

WHEREAS, Northeast 100th Street currently meets the criteria for an arterial both in terms of its functional purpose and its operational characteristics; Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code Section 11.18.010 (Ordinance 108200, Section 2) is amended as follows:

Northeast 100th Street, between First and Fifth Avenues Northeast, is added as an arterial street to the Traffic Code Arterial Map.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.



SUBJECT: Seattle Comprehensive Transportation Program (SCTP)

Dear Mayor Rice:

REQUEST. The Engineering Department requests City Council adoption of the attached Ordinances authorizing changes to the SCTP-Street Classification Map and the Traffic Code Arterial Map. These changes will reclassify Northeast 100th Street between First and Fifth Avenues Northeast, from a non-arterial to a minor arterial.

BACKGROUND. Resolution 27152 adopted Street Classification Guidelines and Street Classification Maps for traffic, transit, truck, bicycle, pedestrian and boulevard classification, and required City Council action to make revisions.

The City Council designated this street as a Principal Transit street in 1987 to accommodate Metro's planned Northgate Transit Center. Northeast 100th Street is not an arterial street, and the adopted Street Classification Guidelines do not allow a Principal Transit designation on a non-arterial street.

The Engineering Department recommends that this street be designated as a Minor Arterial, which would be consistent with its SCTP classification of Principal Transit street. The reclassification would also be consistent with the Office for Long-range Planning's Northgate Plan.


Northeast 100th Street currently meets the criteria for an arterial, both in terms of functional purpose and operational characteristics. Also, in order to accommodate bus service to the Metro Transit Center, the street was reconstructed to arterial standards. No additional

work will be required. The Transit Center is expected to open in February 1992.

IMPORTANCE. City Council adoption of the attached ordinance will allow the necessary changes to be made to the SCTP Street Classification Maps and the Traffic Code Arterial Map.
