ORDINANCE 116337

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AN ORDINANCE authorizing an amendment to the Arboretum agreement between The City of Seattle and the University of Washington to add two members to the Arboretum and Botanical Garden Advisory Committee, and adopting the 1974 Letter of Clarification.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor is authorized to execute for and on behalf of The City of Seattle the attached amendment to the intergovernmental agreement between The City of Seattle and the University of Washington authorized by Ordinance 65130 for the addition of the President of the Arboretum Foundation and a member appointed by the Arboretum Foundation to the Arboretum and Botanical Garden Advisory Committee, and for adopting the 1974 Letter of Clarification approved by Resolution 24646.

Section 2. Execution of the amendment consistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed as an amendment to Ordinance 65130.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

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*FIRST AMENDMENT TO
AGREEMENT RELATING TO
ARBORETUM AND BOTANICAL GARDEN
IN WASHINGTON PARK*

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT is entered into by THE CITY OF SEATTLE (hereinafter referred to as the "City"), a municipal corporation of the State of Washington, acting by and through its Mayor and the Department of Parks & Recreation, and the BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON (hereinafter referred to as the "University"), an agency of the State of Washington, and WITNESSES THAT:

WHEREAS, on or about December 6, 1934, the City, acting by and through its Board of Park Commissioners pursuant to the authority granted by Article XIII, §3 of the City Charter as it existed at that time and Ordinance 65130, and the University, acting by and through the President of its Board of Regents, entered into an Agreement under which the University was granted a license to use and occupy a portion of the City's Washington Park for the purpose of establishing, operating and maintaining a public arboretum (which agreement was entitled "Agreement Relating to Arboretum and Botanical Garden in Washington Park" and is hereinafter referred to as the "AGREEMENT"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to §10 of the AGREEMENT, an advisory committee called the "Arboretum & Botanical Gardens Committee" of seven members was to be, and has been, established, of which three members have been appointed by the Mayor of the

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City, another three members of which have been appointed by the President of the University, and one member of which has been appointed by the Governor of the State of Washington; and

WHEREAS, the members of said advisory committee have recommended to the City and the University that said advisory committee's membership be increased by the addition of two members who represent the Arboretum Foundation; and

WHEREAS, the City and University are willing to increase the number of members on said advisory committee as requested by said advisory committee; NOW, THEREFORE,

IN CONSIDERATION of the promises, covenants, and performances hereinafter described, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Section 10 of the AGREEMENT shall be, and is, amended to read as follows:

10. An advisory committee to be known as the "Arboretum and Botanical Garden Committee: and consisting of nine members is hereby created. The membership of such committee shall be selected as follows: The City's Mayor and the University's President shall each appoint three committee members; the Governor of the State of Washington shall be requested to appoint one committee member; the President of the Arboretum Foundation shall serve as a committee member ex officio; and the Arboretum Foundation shall designate the remaining member according to procedures determined by said Foundation. The appointees of the Mayor, University President, and Governor shall each serve for a term of seven years, commencing on the first day of January next succeeding such member's appointment, and shall remain in such position after the expiration of such seven year term until such member's successor shall have been appointed and qualified. The member selected according to procedures of

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the Arboretum Foundation shall serve for a term, not longer than seven years, as specified by said Foundation, and shall remain in such position after the expiration of such term until such member's successor shall have been appointed and qualified. In the event any position on said advisory committee becomes vacant because of a member's resignation or death, the advisory committee shall request the appropriate authority to fill such vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term to preserve the staggered nature of the terms of such positions.

2. The City and University acknowledge that the document entitled "Letter of Clarification of the 1934 Agreement Between The City of Seattle and the University of Washington Concerning the Establishment and maintenance of an Arboretum in Washington Park, Seattle, Washington" executed on or about August 23, 1974, and endorsed and adopted by the City pursuant to Resolution 24646 of the City Council thereof effected certain changes in the relationship between the City and University that was contemplated in the 1934 AGREEMENT. That 1974 "Letter of Clarification..." (a copy of which is attached hereto as "Appendix 1") is incorporated to this Amendment by this reference and attachment and shall hereafter be treated and understood to have been an amendment of the AGREEMENT to the extent it added to, deleted from, or otherwise modified any of the terms and conditions of the AGREEMENT.

3. No provision of the AGREEMENT shall be understood to have been, or be treated as having been, modified by this Amendment except §10 thereof and those portions of the AGREEMENT previously modified by the aforementioned "Letter of Clarification..." Nothing herein shall affect the terms of the seven advisory committee members appointed prior to the effective date of this amendment, which terms are hereby confirmed.

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



Subject: Proposed Amendment to Agreement Relating to
Arboretum and Botanical Garden in Washington Park

Attached for your consideration and approval is a draft Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to amend an existing agreement between the University of Washington, State of Washington and the City over the number and composition of members on the Arboretum and Botanical Garden Advisory Committee. The original agreement, formed in 1934, called for a committee made up of representatives appointed by the State (1), University of Washington (3) and the City (3). The attached amendment, suggested by the Committee, proposes adding two representatives from among the Arboretum Foundation, a non-profit civic organization dedicated to preserving and enhancing the Arboretum in Washington Park.

I recommend that you approve this proposal and the authorizing legislation. The Arboretum Foundation, 58 years old, has already provided the City and University with consistently growing support in docent care and public education programs, as well as, fundraising for capital improvements. These efforts, coupled with operating staff support from the University's Center for Urban Horticulture and support from City Park and Recreation staff have allowed the Arboretum and Japanese Gardens to enjoy an international reputation.

PROCESS: Attached is a draft amendment which was prepared by the City Attorney's office. Upon passage of the proposed ordinance, (also attached), it is anticipated that the Mayor would sign and forward the proposed amendment, along with his endorsement, to the University and the State for signing by the President, Board of Regents and the Governor, respectively. I am also attaching the Committee's proposal and background information describing the committee's advisory function.

Re: Request for Increase in Committee Membership

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I am writing on behalf of the Arboretum and Botanical Garden Advisory Committee, to recommend that the City of Seattle, the State of Washington, and the University of Washington agree to an amendment in the 1934 Agreement Relating to Arboretum and Botanical Garden in Washington Park (see attached). This amendment would increase the number of voting members on the Arboretum and Botanical Garden Advisory Committee to a total of nine by inviting the Arboretum Foundation to name these two new appointments.

The Arboretum and Botanical Garden Advisory Committee was established through a provision in this agreement, but was not activated until 1974. The role of the Committee has not expanded from that described in the 1934 agreement. However, the range of issues affecting the Arboretum has been magnified by growing pressure placed upon the park as a result of urban growth. Complex issues face the City and University in managing the Arboretum, including: shorelines and wetlands preservation, recycling, transportation, bike paths, violent crime, vandalism and homelessness. The University, State, City government, non-profit support (Foundation) and the surrounding neighborhoods all have a stake in the Arboretum's future. The Committee serves as a forum in which to discuss these complex issues and advise the City and University.

Over the past 16 years, the Arboretum Foundation has emerged as a prominent non-profit civic organization dedicated to preserving the Arboretum's historic legacy and exceptional collection. Foundation membership now over 3,000 strong, has provided both time and money to improve the collections and the facilities. In addition, the Foundation has, along with the University's Center for Urban Horticulture, taken an active role in providing educational opportunities for schools and the general public.



The Committee was created as part of the original 1934 Agreement between the City and the University. Their original role was described as part of that Agreement. There is no record that the Committee was either appointed or activated at that time. In 1974, as part of the negotiations on the Letter of Clarification to the 1934 Agreement, it was verbally agreed that the Committee should be activated (or reactivated) to serve as an advisory body to the Superintendent of Parks. The Committee members were then appointed in 1975 by the designated appointers.

AGREEMENT RELATING TO ARBORETUM AND
BOTANICAL GARDEN IN WASHINGTON PARK

THIS AGREEMENT, made by and between the City of Seattle, a municipal corporation, organized under the laws of the State of Washington, herein designated First Party, and the Board of Regents of the University of Washington, herein designated Second Party.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, first party, is the owner of certain park property situate within the territorial limits of the City of Seattle, known as Washington Park; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto wish to establish and maintain within said Washington Park an arboretum and botanical garden; and

WHEREAS, second party is willing to take charge of planning for and the establishment of such arboretum and botanical garden; Now, Therefore,

In order to establish and maintain such arboretum and botanical garden, and in consideration of their mutual agreements, as herein set forth, it is agreed by and between the parties herein as follows:

1. First party hereby grants to second party the right to use all or any portion of said Washington Park as now established or as may be hereafter extended (as more specifically set forth in the map hereto attached, marked Exhibit "A"), for an arboretum and said botanical garden, second party to designate in writing from time to time the exact areas which it desires to devote to such use.

2. First party shall, at its own expense as funds are available, construct and maintain all roads, driveways, walks, water systems, lighting facilities, and such other permanent improvements as may be necessary to make accessible such scientific, educational and recreational advantages as may be derived from the establishment and maintenance of such arboretum and botanical garden.

3. First party agrees to use such funds as it may have available for the establishment of said arboretum, and to cooperate with second party in the establishment and maintenance of said arboretum and botanical garden, and to that end to donate such seeds, plants, shrubs, trees, equipment and labor as may be available.

4. Second party will, as soon as practicable, have prepared plans for such arboretum and botanical garden, and submit same to first party for the approval of its Board of Park Commissioners, and thereafter the development of said arboretum shall be substantially in accordance with such plans as originally prepared and so approved with

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such modifications as may be made therein with the approval of both parties.

5. Second party shall, as soon as possible, establish such arboretum and botanical garden, including in such work, among other things, the following items:

- (a) Procuring seeds and plants from all parts of the world that may be suitable for growth in this climate;
- (b) Establish quarantine station for the introduction of plants, shrubs and trees from foreign countries;
- (c) Carry on experiments in the cultivation and growth of all forms of plant life;
- (d) Establish special collections, such as of native plants and trees, these illustrating plant relations, apline groups, and other like collections;
- (e) Establish and maintain an herbarium;
- (f) Provide plant material for use of classes in the public schools and University.

6. Second party shall, subject to the provisions of Section 3 of Article XIII of the City Charter, have full control of the area devoted to said arboretum and botanical garden; provided, however, that such area shall be made available to visits by the public generally, under rules and regulation adopted by the second party and approved by the first party by its Board of Park Commissioners.

7. Second party shall have the right at such time or times as funds may be available, to erect suitable buildings and greenhouses for the use of the arboretum and botanical garden, and shall have the control thereof subject to the provisions of the City Charter, Article XIII, Section 3.

8. First party shall police the entire park including the portions used for said arboretum and botanical garden, and shall keep in good repair the walks and driveways leading to and within the area used as such arboretum, all in the same manner and to the same extent as in the absence of this agreement.

9. It is understood that first party shall have at all times access to every part of said arboretum and botanical gardens, including the buildings, for general visitation and the carrying out of such supervision and policing as first party shall deem necessary.

10. An advisory committee to be known as the Arboretum and Botanical Garden Committee, consisting of at least seven members is hereby created, three to be appointed by the Mayor of Seattle, three by the President of the University of Washington, and the seventh member to be appointed by the Governor of the State of Washington.

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(10 - Continued)

Each of said members shall serve for a term of seven years from the first day of January, next succeeding their appointment, and until their successors shall have been appointed and qualified. Provide, however, that the first board named shall serve for terms of one, two, three, four, five, six and seven years, respectively, the particular term for which each of said first board members shall serve to be determined by lot.

11. Said advisory committee shall assist the parties hereto in establishing and maintaining said arboretum and botanical garden, in securing funds for the establishment and maintenance of said arboretum, and plants and seeds for use therein, in interesting people in said project, and in acting as a liaison committee between the Arboretum and the various garden and other societies interested in such Arboretum.

12. This agreement shall remain in full force and effect so long as such arboretum and botanical garden shall be maintained.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this agreement in duplicate this 6th day of December, 1934.
