AN ORDINANCE authorizing a grant agreement with the State of Washington, Department of Community Development for a multi-jurisdictional prosecution task force and the continuation of an interlocal agreement with King County; refunding positions; and increasing certain expenditure allowances in the 1992 Budget of the Law Department, the unexpended portion of which will carry forward to 1993.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Attorney is hereby authorized for and on behalf of The City of Seattle to execute and the City Comptroller to attest to a grant agreement with the United States of America, Department of Justice for a grant for the period :Tuly 1, 1992 through June 30, 1993 in the amount of One Hundred Thirty Eight Thousand Two Hundred Fifty-seven Dollars (\$138,257) for the continuation of a multi-jurisdictional prosecution task force with emphasis on misdemeanants, who have or are engaged in drug-related activity, under the Federal 1991 Drug Control and System Improvement Formula Grant Program to carry out the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988. The City Attorney is authorized to act as the representative of the City in connection with the grant agreement and to make such assurances, representations, and reports as may be requested by the United States in connection therewith. Acceptance of the grant funds is hereby approved, and the grant funds, when received, shall be deposited to the credit of the General Fund.

Section 2. To implement the grant agreement authorized in Section 1, the City Attorney is authorized for and on behalf of The City of Seattle to execute and the City Comptroller to attest to an extension of the 1992 interlocal into with King County providing for Assistant City Attorneys, deputized as deputy King County prosecuting attorneys, to prosecute cases filed in King County District Courts; for operational assistance to and by the King County Police; and for King County to pay the City a matching share of the cost of the

project, estimated at Eleven Thousand Six Hundred Twelve Dollars (\$11,612). The funds when received shall be deposited to the credit of the General Fund.

Section 3. To implement the grant agreement authorized in Section 1 and the extension of the 1992 interlocal agreement authorized in Section 2, the following positions are hereby refunded in the Law Department, Criminal Prosecution Program, for the duration of the grant funding at the salary range indicated:

The City Attorney is authorized to fill the positions in the Law Department subject to personnel laws and rules, and each department head shall pay persons appointed to fill such positions at rates of pay provided for like positions in the Salary and Compensation Schedule.

Section 4. To carry out the multi-jurisdiction prosecution task force project, the expenditure allowances for the following Objects of Expenditure in the 1992 Budget of the Law Department, Criminal Prosecution Program and Program Category (SFMS Code J15) are increased as shown:

For such purposes, the sum of One Hundred Forty-nine Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty-two Dollars (\$149,862.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the appropriate expenditure accounts from the General Fund. Of This

sum, One Hundred Thirty Eight Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$138,250) or so much as may be received from the State of Washington, shall be reimbursed from the grant funds authorized in Section 1; and Eleven Thousand Six Hundred Twelve Dollars (\$11,612), or so much as may be received from King County, shall be reimbursed pursuant to the extension of the interlocal agreement authorized in Section 2 hereof. The City Comptroller is authorized to draw and the City Treasurer to pay the necessary warrants and to make the necessary transfers.

Notwithstanding the provisions of RCW 35.32A.080, the appropriations herein made shall not lapse but shall be carried forward to the 1993 Budget of the Law Department.

Section 5. Execution of the grant agreement and the interlocal agreement, retention of personnel and implementation of the program consistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.

Re: Legislation to Continue High Impact Offender Project

Dear Councilmember Benson:

In 1990 the City Council approved the creation of the High Impact Offender Project, a federally funded program aimed at emphasizing the vigorous prosection of misdemeanors committed by habitual criminals who have been convicted of drug related criminal activity. The Project is operated by the Criminal Division of the City Attorney's Office in cooperation with the King County Prosecuting Attorney. The Project has been funded by 75% federal funds and 25% local funds, with the local match being split between Seattle (75%) and King County (25%).

Federal funding for the Project (\$138,250) has been renewed for federal fiscal year 1992-1993 and the Mayor has included the City matching appropriation (\$46,448) in the 1993 budget. These funds support two City prosecutors, one paralegal and one administrative specialist I. The attached legislation will authorize the renewal of pertinent contracts, positions and expenditures to continue the project from July 1, 1992 until the end of the federal fiscal year on June 30, 1993. The Project has continuing funding participation by the King County Prosecutor through December, 1992. At the present time, the County matching funds have not been specifically included in the County's 1993 budget. In the event that County funding is not forthcoming, the Project will be appropriately modified in a manner that will not significantly impact the prosecution of City cases.

I believe that the Project has had continued success in meeting its goals and has the support of the Mayor, Chief Fitzsimons and King County Prosecutor Norm Maleng. I am requesting you refer the attached proposed legislation to the Council's Public Safety Committee. I appreciate your assistance.
