The attached legislation is to increase the expenditure authorities in the 1992 Families and Education Levy budgets for the Department of Housing and Human Services, the Department of Parks and Recreation, and the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health by appropriating money from the Educational and Developmental Services Fund for various Families and Education Levy programs and services.

Background: Last year was the first year of operation for the Families and Education Levy. For a variety of reasons, a number of Levy-funded programs did not fully expend the resources appropriated. A total of \$4,211,825 of Levy funds were appropriated, and some \$666,929 of this amount was not expended last year for various program and service commitments. Much of this underexpenditure is in School District programs which run on an academic year budget cycle rather than the City's calendar budget cycle. Other underexpenditures resulted from new programs starting up slowly to full operations as staff were hired.

The proposed legislation is consistent with the actions approved by the Levy Oversight Committee to carry forward those unexpended resources for 1992 Levy programs and services. It would increase expenditure authorities of the City departments to contract services with the School District and other community based agencies for services consistent with their 1991 program commitment.

The attached spreadsheet lists individual programs, amounts, responsible departments, and Levy components. Any savings remain within the Educational and Developmental Services Fund will be used for future allocation.
