

Dear Council President Benson:

The Seattle Police Department requests that the City Council adopt the attached ordinance that will ratify and accept the acquisition of real property. The property was acquired as the result of a drug seizure under state law (RCW 59.60.505) and subsequent forfeiture hearing initiated by the Seattle Police Department, in King County Superior Court. A copy of the Settlement Agreement is attached.

The ordinance will authorize the immediate sale of this property and reduce maintenance expenses to the City. It will also allow the Chief of Police to contract with a licensed real estate broker or agent to sell the property. The Police Department has been advised by the Law Department that the acquisition and sale of real property by the City must be authorized by city ordinance.

The seized property under consideration is a house, located at 5412-30th Avenue S.W. It's appraised market value is estimated to be \$70,000 (low estimate).

The total estimated cost associated with selling the house is \$47,000, summarized below:

\$20,000 = Payoff mortgage (after "catch-up" costs)

8,000 = Contractors will perform necessary plumbing and electrical work, per arrangement by a Realtor.

Payment will be deferred until after closure of house sale.

7,000 = Cost Recovery by the City, as allowed by the "Seizure statute," to compensate for investigative and prosecutor time

7,000 = Realty agent fees associated with closing costs
5,000 = Legal fees paid to defendant's attorney, as
determined by settlement agreement

\$47,000 = Total Estimated Cost Associated with Selling

The estimated Sale Proceeds will be \$23,000, which will be divided between the City and the Defendant's Estate, per settlement agreement:

\$70,000 = Appraised Market Value 47.000 = Total Selling Costs \$23,000 = Sale Proceeds

\$13,800 = City of Seattle (60% of Sale Proceeds)
9,200 = Defendant's Estate (40% of Sale Proceeds)

The estimated Gross Proceeds to the City will be \$20,800:

\$13,800 = 60% Share of Sale Proceeds

7.000 = Cost Recovery

\$20,800 = Gross Proceeds to the City

The City of Seattle's estimated Net Proceeds will be \$18,720 and the State's will be \$2,080:

\$18,720 = Net Proceeds to City Drug Forfeiture Fund (90%)
2,080 = Net Proceeds to Washington State (10%)

This letter confirms our settlement discussions of January 17,

I understand our agreement, pending final approval by the estate's representative, to be:

That the property be sold at fair market value; That the City would be paid its costs from the proceeds of the sale, not to exceed \$7,000.00; That the proceeds that remain be split between the parties with the City receiving 60% and the estate

receiving 40%; and
That the defendant agrees to dismiss any pending
suit-end hereby agrees to release and forever
discharge the City and its agents from any claims
arising from the seizure of both the Burien and
West Seattle property, including any and all claims
brought or that could have been brought by the
defendant with respect to these properties

An initial analysis of the City's costs with regard to the subject property shows that the costs exceed \$7,000.00. However, the City in its last offer agreed to settle its costs for \$7,000.00.
