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ORDINANCE 117111

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Housing and Human Services authorizing application to and agreement with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for an Innovative Homeless Initiative Demonstration Program, increasing expenditure allowances in the Housing and Community Development Revenue Sharing Fund and making the necessary appropriations therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As requested by the Director of Housing and Human Services and recommended by the Director in the memorandum attached hereto, the Mayor or his designee is authorized for and on behalf of The City of Seattle to apply for financial assistance from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for an Innovative Homeless Initiative Demonstration Program grant in an amount of up to One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000), and upon acceptance of such application, the Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute for and on behalf of The City of Seattle an agreement in such counterparts as may be necessary for the purpose contemplated by the application. Funds, when received, shall be deposited into the Housing and Community Development Revenue Sharing Fund. The Mayor or his designee is further authorized to execute and deliver such other documents relating to the agreement as may be required in connection therewith. The agreement and such other documents shall be in form and content consistent with the City Charter and other applicable law.

Section 2. Contingent upon the execution by the City and HUD of the agreement authorized in Section 1 hereof, the expenditure allowance in the Housing and Community Development Revenue Sharing Fund is hereby increased by SIX HUNDRED FORTY-THREE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-TWO DOLLARS (\$643,172.00) or such lesser amount as may be granted by HUD under such agreement, and such amount is hereby appropriated from such Fund for the purposes stated in the



2 reimbursed from funds to be received under the agreement
3 authorized in Section 1 hereof.

4 Section 3. The appropriation under this Ordinance shall
5 carry forward from year to year unless expressly abandoned by
6 Ordinance.


7 Section 4. Execution of the agreement authorized in Section
8 1 hereof, and other acts pursuant to the authority and prior to
9 the effective date of this ordinance, are hereby ratified and
10 confirmed.

The Department is pleased to present the attached legislation for the receipt of new federal resources to assist Seattle's comprehensive efforts to help homeless people.

In early January, working under a very short three-week timeline laid out by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), City and County staff developed the proposed program centered around three broad themes:

- o Serve persons with chemical dependency issues, both single adults and families.
- o Help persons end cycles of homelessness by helping them successfully move into and remain in permanent housing.
- o Help persons cut across barriers to assistance between different service systems such as chemical dependency, employment or housing by providing the resources for them to obtain needed services, rather than relying solely upon the services for which they are categorically eligible.

The HUD program priorities focused on helping local communities fill gaps in the continuum of care and favored application by the City as the entity most in touch with local needs. Following intensive work by a team from the City, King County, the Homeless Family Project and Central Seattle Recovery Center, an application was developed for \$995,400 for a three year program. The proposal linked new

support assistance and case managers with housing to be obtained through the County's successful application to HUD for Shelter Plus Care subsidized housing units.

The City was formally notified on February 24 that the application had been approved for funding in the amount of \$643,172, sufficient for two years of the planned services.

The City will contract with the Homeless Family Project and Central Seattle Recovery Center for the following activities:

- o Through a centralized intake system, identify families and individuals with chemical dependency problems, assess the individuals, and determine services necessary to help them obtain and keep permanent housing.
- o Employ three case managers at Central Seattle Recovery Center to serve fifteen families and thirty-five individuals and two case managers at the Homeless Families Project to serve thirty families. The case managers will provide support services and help individuals and families maintain successful long term housing.
- o Obtain subsidized housing through the Shelter Plus Care program.
- o Provide individual client based resources to help persons obtain needed assistance.

Contracts for these services are presently being developed and services are expected to begin next month.

The legislation attached would authorize the application for and receipt of this new grant and would make the necessary appropriation in the Housing and Community Development Revenue Sharing Fund. No new City positions are required.
