ORDINANCE 118003

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Engineering Department; repealing section 11.16.160 of the Municipal Code and adding a new section to Chapter 11.16 of the Municipal Code to provide authority for the director of engineering or a designee to appoint a city traffic engineer.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Traffic and Transportation Division - Repealed. Section 11.16.160 of the Seattle Municipal Code is hereby repealed.

Section 2. New Section. A new section, Section 11.16.170, is added to the Seattle Municipal Code to read as follows:

11.16.170 Traffic Engineer - Appointment. The Director of Engineering, or a designee, shall appoint a City Traffic Engineer who shall be a registered professional engineer, and who shall be directly responsible to and supervised by the Director of Engineering or the Director's designee.

Section 3. Ratification. Any acts made consistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. Effectiveness. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its approval by the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten (10) days after presentation, it shall take effect as provided by Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.



Subject: Amending Traffic Engineer Reporting Relationship

Honorable Members:

Enclosed is an ordinance amending the Seattle Municipal Code section 11.16 and repealing section 11.16.160. This change is being done to bring our code in compliance with the RCW 46.90.260 and RCW 46.90.265, which were repealed by the State Legislature in 1993 and became effective in July, 1994.

This change gives more flexibility in the reporting relationship of the Traffic Engineer within the Seattle Engineering Department. The current code requires this position to report directly to the Director of Engineering. This change will allow the Traffic Engineering to report either to the Director or the Director's designee. This will give the Director more flexibility in making appointments in his senior management team.

I recommend that the enclosed ordinance be adopted to make these needed changes comply with State law changes.
