AN ORDINANCE relating to the Department of Housing and Human Services, authorizing an agreement with the City of Bellevue for financial assistance for the provision of employment services to seniors, creating a position, increasing the expenditure allowance in the 1996 budget of the Department of Housing and Human Services, and ratifying and confirming prior acts, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As requested by the Director of the Department of Housing and Human Services and recommended by the Mayor, the Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement for financial assistance from the City of Bellevue in the amount of Seven Thousand Seven Hundred Forty-Five Dollars (\$7,745) for the provision of employment services for residents of Bellevue and east King County age 55 and older, and, upon acceptance of such application, the Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute and deliver for and on behalf of The City of Seattle an agreement in such counterparts as may be necessary to accept the financial assistance. Funds, when received, shall be deposited into the Housing and Human Services Operating Fund. The Mayor or his designee is further authorized to execute and deliver such other documents relating to the agreement as may be required in connection therewith. The agreement and such other documents shall be in form and content consistent with the City Charter and other applicable law.

Section 2. Contingent upon the execution of the agreement authorized in Section 1 hereof, the expenditure allowance for the following object of expenditure in the 1996 budget of the Department of Housing and Human Services, Program and Program Category Division on Aging (Code H1100), is hereby increased as follows:

PS Personal Services \$7,745

by the appropriation, hereby made and authorized, from the Housing and Human Services Operating Fund of the sum of Seven Thousand Seven Hundred Forty-Five Dollars (\$7,745), such funds to be reimbursed from funds to be received under the agreement authorized in Section 1 hereof.

All appropriations of the above grant funds in this Ordinance shall carry forward from year to year unless expressly abandoned by ordinance.

Section 3. Contingent upon the execution of the agreement authorized in Section 1 hereof and effective upon the date of execution of such agreement, the following position is hereby created in the Department of Housing and Human Services:

1 Employment Program Specialist .20 FTE.

The Director of Housing and Human Services is authorized to fill the position authorized in this section subject to civil service laws and rules. The position created by this ordinance shall continue only so long as funding from the agreement authorized in Section 1 or funding from a similar agreement is available.

Section 4. Execution of the agreement authorized in Section 1 hereof, and other acts pursuant to the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance, are hereby ratified and confirmed.





SUBJECT: Legislation Regarding Financial Resources from the City
of Bellevue for the Provision of Senior Employment Services

Last summer, the Mayor's Office for Senior Citizens (MOSC), a program of the Division on Aging, submitted a proposal to the City of Bellevue for the provision of employment services for low income seniors in the Bellevue and east King County area. Following a competitive selection process, the City of Bellevue has awarded funding for this innovative program. As one of the 13 federally-recognized Area Agencies on Aging in Washington state, the Division on Aging is responsible for the administration of programs and services for the elderly throughout King County. This new cooperative venture with the City of Bellevue is significant in that it will allow the expansion of senior employment services to better meet the needs of seniors living outside Seattle.

The relatively modest funding of \$7,745 will support the costs of a .20 FTE Employment Program Specialist who will be stationed at the new North Bellevue Senior Center two days per week from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. This Employment Program Specialist will be linked with the Employment Resource Center staff of the MOSC and will draw and build upon the expertise and resources of the MOSC's long and successful experience in providing employment services to people age 55 and older. Services include job counseling, referral and placement as well as job follow-up and evaluation. It is expected that 103 persons will be served

through this program in 1996 and that 16 job placements will be made. Program services are expected to be available beginning in March.

The attached legislation would authorize the agreement, appropriate funds and create at additional .20 FTE Employment Program Specialist, funded wholly from the new resources. The position request is being coordinated with the City Personnel Department. Please contact Nita Richardson, Director of the MOSC, at 684-0492 should additional information be needed.
